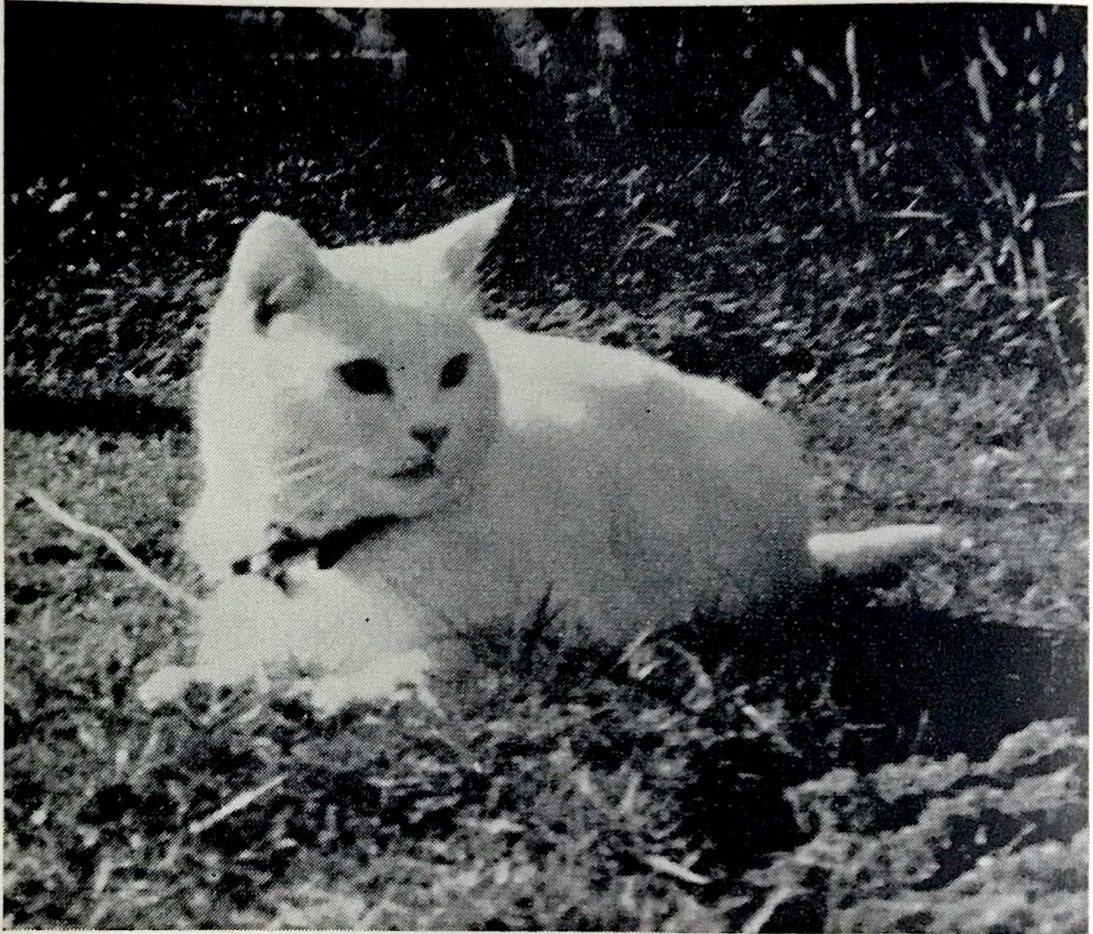


## BRITISH WHITE SHORT-HAIR

### **BRITISH WHITE SHORT-HAIR :**

The British White should be a powerfully built cat with a full broad chest. The head should be broad between the ears, the cheeks should be well developed and the face and nose should be short. The white coat should be untinged with yellow and the eyes should be sapphire blue (Breed 14) or golden orange or copper (Breed 14a).

## BRITISH BLACK SHORT-HAIR

The type of the British Black should be well knit and powerful on the body with legs of good substance and in proportion. The chest should be full and broad and the tail should be thick at the base. The head should be broad between the ears, the cheeks should be well developed and the face and nose should be short. The coat should be jet black to the roots with no rusty tinge or white hairs. The eyes should be large and round and deep copper or orange with no trace of green.

The British Blue should truly be a well-knit cat of powerful appearance. The chest should be broad and full and the legs should be of good substance and in proportion. The head should be broad between the ears, the cheeks should be well developed and the face and nose should be short. The ears should be small, slightly rounded at the tops and not large at the base. The coat should be short, fine and close and in colour light to medium blue. The colour should be level and no tabby markings, shading or white hairs should be apparent. The eyes should be large, full and copper, orange or yellow in colour.

The Silver Tabby should be a well-knit powerful cat showing good depth of body. The tail should be thick at the base and well set, with length in proportion to the body. The chest should be full and broad. The legs should be of good substance and in proportion to the body. The feet should be neat and well rounded. The head should be broad between the ears, the cheeks well developed and the face and nose short. The ears should be small, slightly round at the tops and should not be large at the base. The coat should be short, fine and close in texture and the markings should be dense black, not mixed with the ground colour and quite distinct from it. The ground colour should be pure, clear silver, uniform throughout, and with no white anywhere. The eyes should be round and well opened and should be green or hazel in colour.

The eyes should be round, well opened and green or hazel in colour.

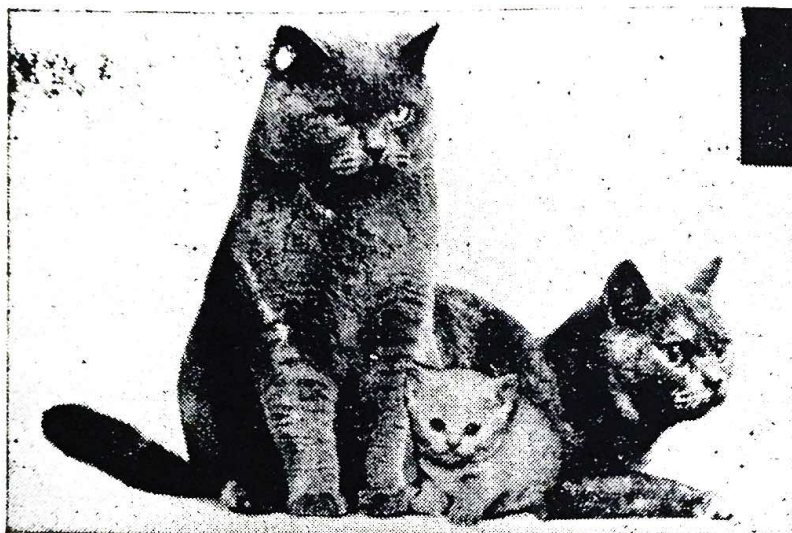

## BRITISH TORTOISESHELL

The Tortoiseshell Short-Hair should be of the same type as the other cats of the British classification. The colour should be black and red (the red being both light and dark). The colour should be equally balanced and each colour should be as brilliant as possible. There should be no white. The patches should be clear and defined with no blurring and no tabby or brindle markings. The legs, feet and tail should be as well patched as the body and head. A red blaze is desirable. The eyes may be orange, copper or hazel.

The patches should be clear and defined and a white blaze is desirable. White should never predominate. No hard and fast rule can be laid down for the patching of Tortie-and-Whites. The eyes should be orange, copper or hazel.

## BRITISH BI-COLOURS

The Bi-Colour S.H. should be British in type and fifty points are allocated in this respect. The remaining points are awarded on coat pattern and colour. The colours follow those of the other British S.H. and therefore can be Black and White, Blue and White, Red and White, or Cream and White. Tabby and White is not allowed. The colour should start immediately behind the shoulders, round the legs and leaving the hind feet white. The ears and mask should also be coloured. The shoulders, neck, forelegs and feet and chin should be white. There should be a blaze up the face and over the top of the head, joining or running into the white at the back of the skull, thus dividing the mask exactly in half. The markings should be similar to those of a Dutch Rabbit. The eyes should be copper or amber.

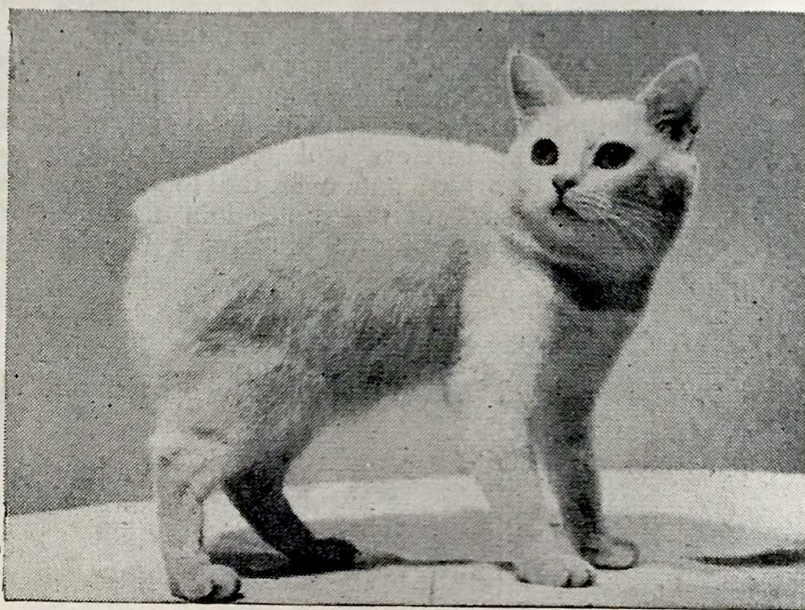

Three Challenge Certificates, one Premier Certificate. Three times Best in Show. Brumas was neutered after reaching Championship status and has since become a film and television star.

### **MANX :**

The essential qualities in the Manx Cat are taillessness, height of hindquarters, shortness of back and depth of flank, as only the combination of all these qualities can produce the characteristic hopping gait. The coat is what is termed "Double," namely, soft and open like that of a rabbit, with a soft, thick undercoat. Great attention must also be paid to roundness of rump—as round as an orange being the ideal. Taillessness should be absolutely complete and there should be a decided hollow at the end of the spine, where in the tailed cat the tail would begin. The hindquarters cannot be too high and the back cannot be too short. The head should be round and large, but the nose should be longer than in the British Cat. The cheeks are required to be prominent, thus avoiding any impression of snipiness, which would be a bad fault. The ears are rather wide at the base, tapering slightly off to a point. Eye and coat colour are of secondary consideration and are only taken into account when all other points are equal. Gait is of primary importance.

She has been Best Manx eleven times, having been exhibited on thirteen occasions. Altogether she has won a total of 54 first prizes. She is accompanied today by one of her white kittens.
