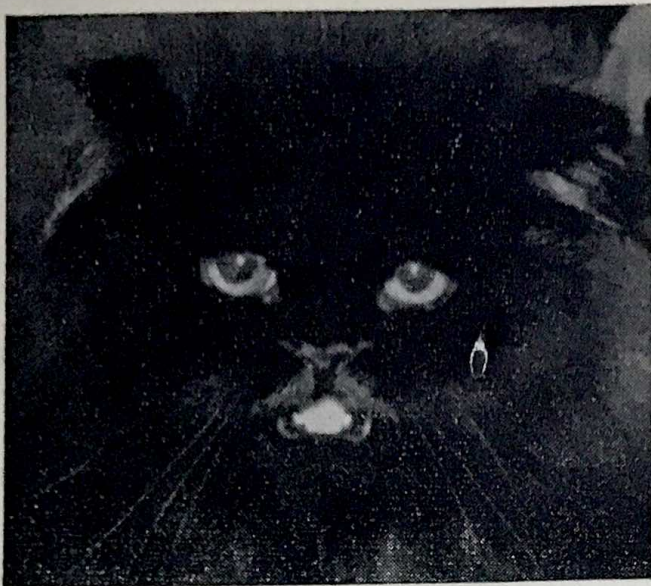

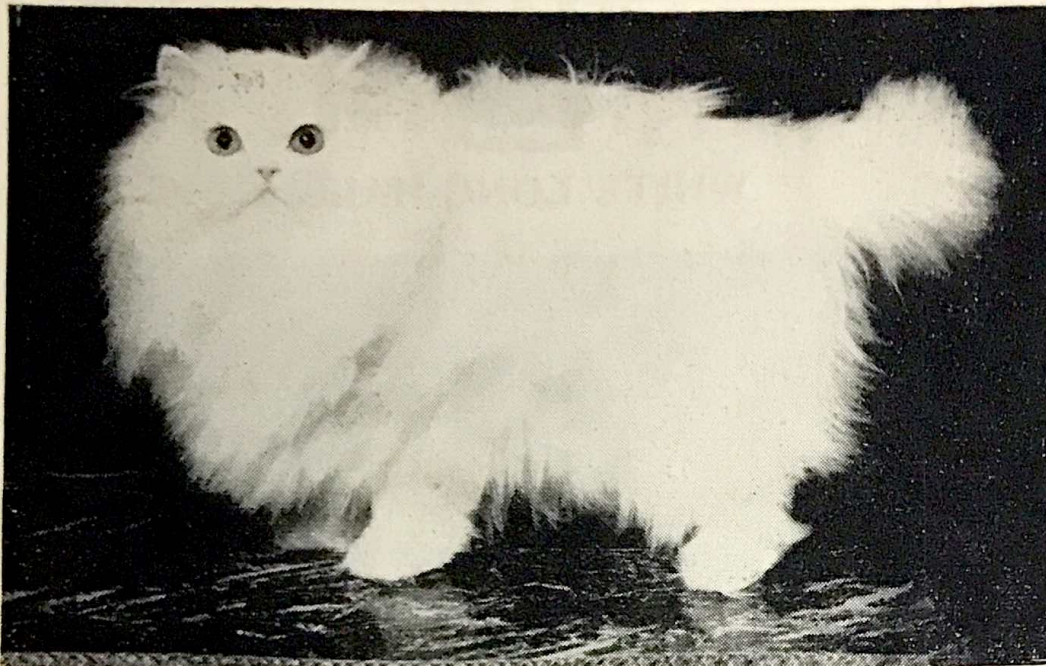

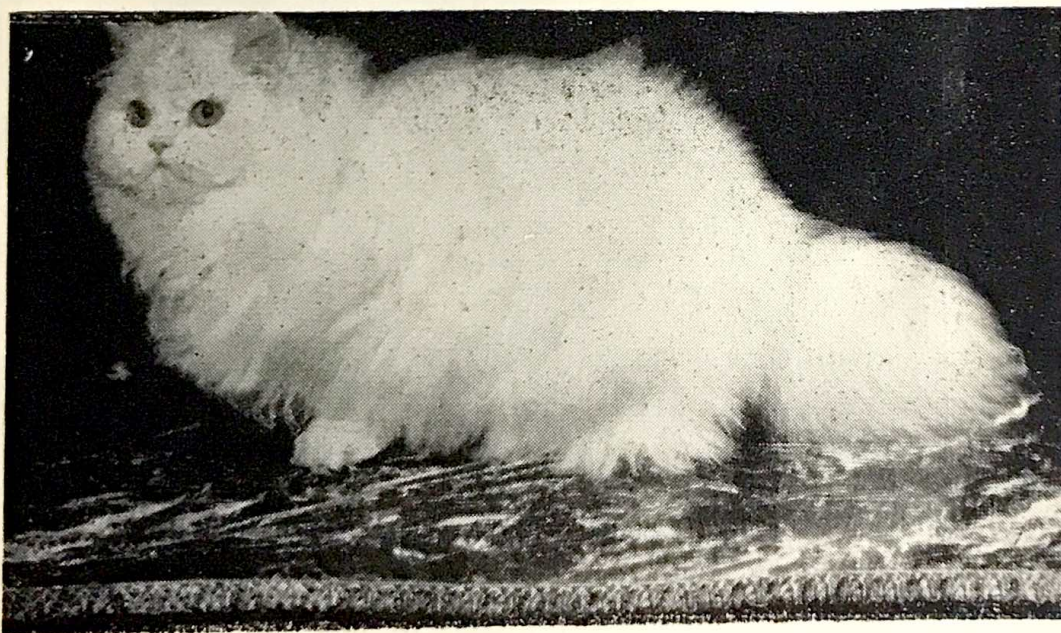

WHITE LONG-HAIR (BLUE-EYED) :

The Long-Hair White should be of cobby, massive type and should stand firm and low on the legs. The head should be round and broad with plenty of space between the ears, which should be small, neat and well covered. The cat should have a short nose, full cheeks and a broad muzzle. The eyes should be large, round and wide open and deep blue in colour. The coat should be pure white without markings or shading of any kind.

WHITE LONG-HAIR (ORANGE-EYED)

The description of the Orange-Eyed White is similar in almost every respect to that of the Blue-Eyed White. However, the eyes, instead of being blue, should be orange or copper in colour.

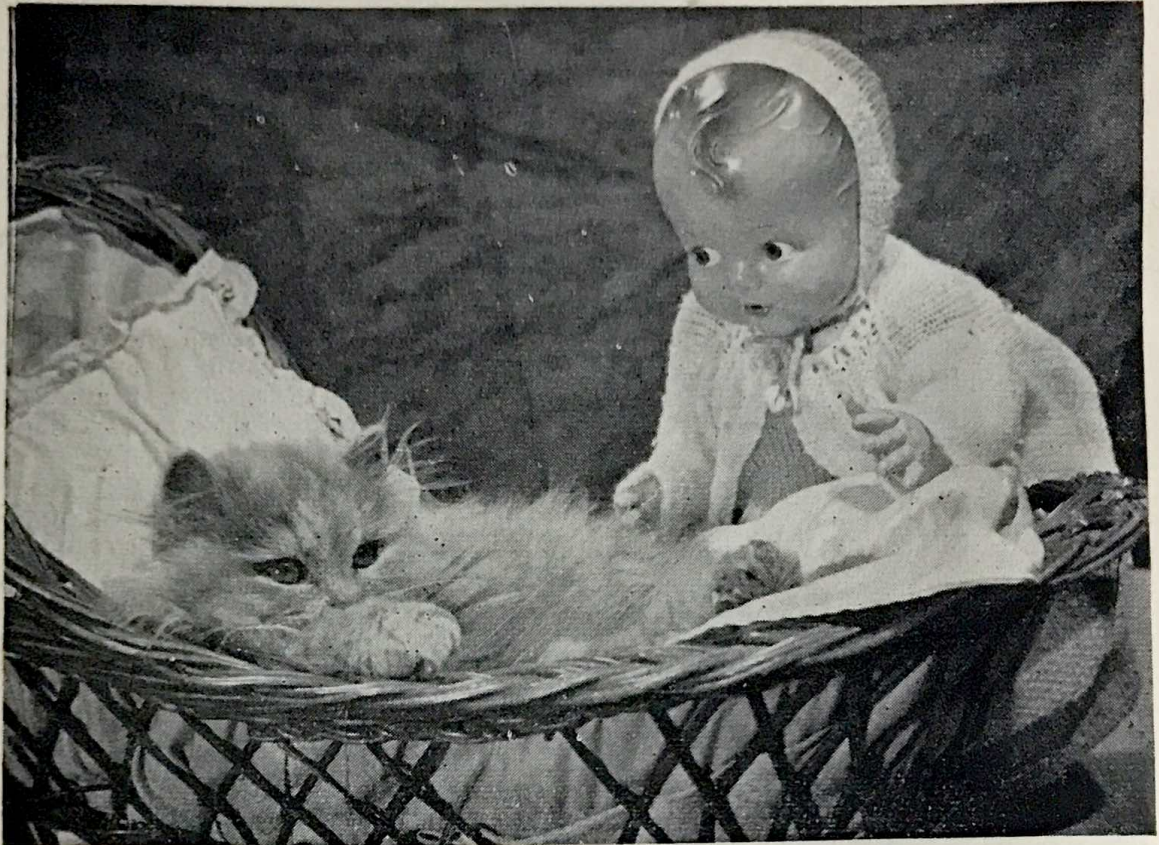

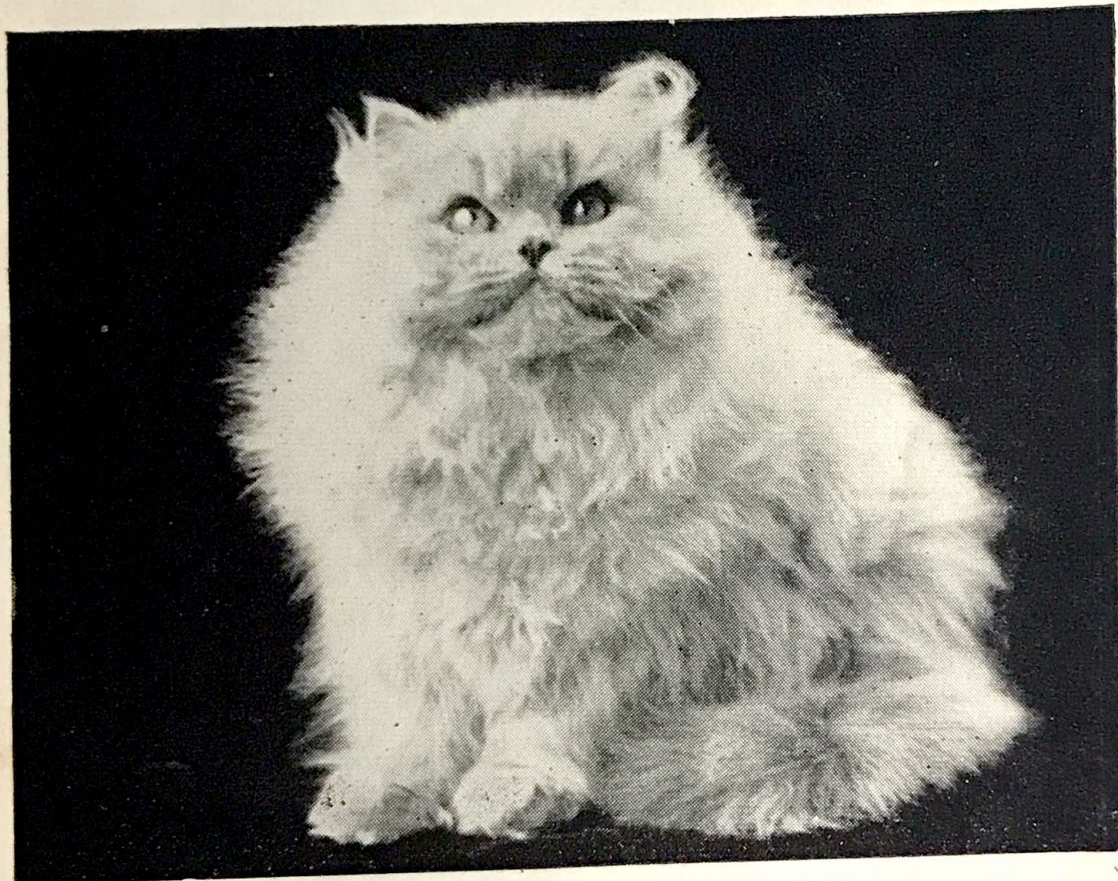

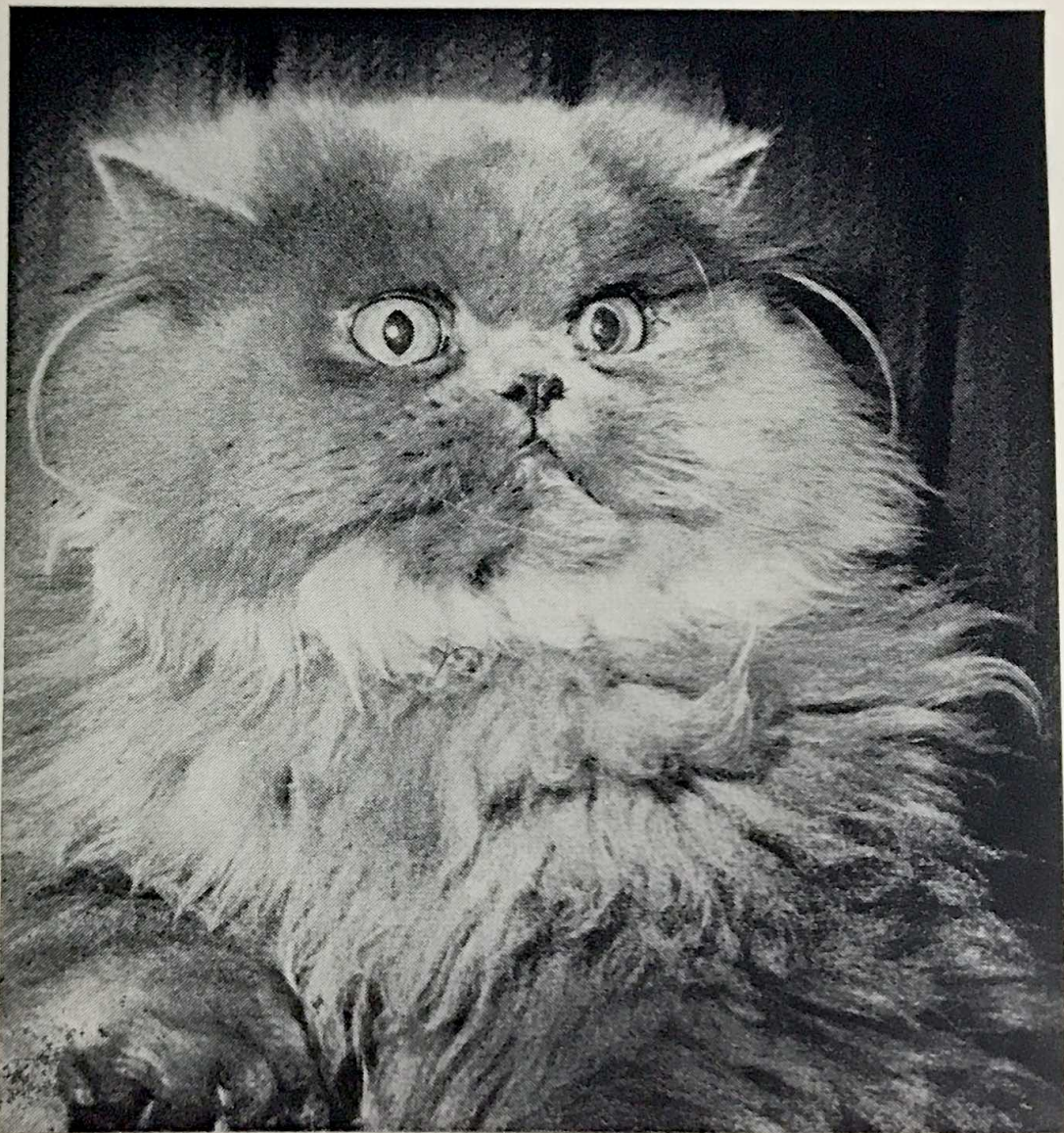

The Blue Long-Hair should be cobby in type and low on the legs. It should have a short, full tail, not tapering. A kink is regarded as a fault. The head should be broad and round with width between the ears. The face and nose should be short, the ears small and well tufted and the cheeks well developed. The eyes should be deep orange or copper, large, round and full without trace of green. Any shade of blue is allowable, but should be sound and even in colour, free from markings or any white hairs. The fur should be long, thick and soft in texture and the frill full.

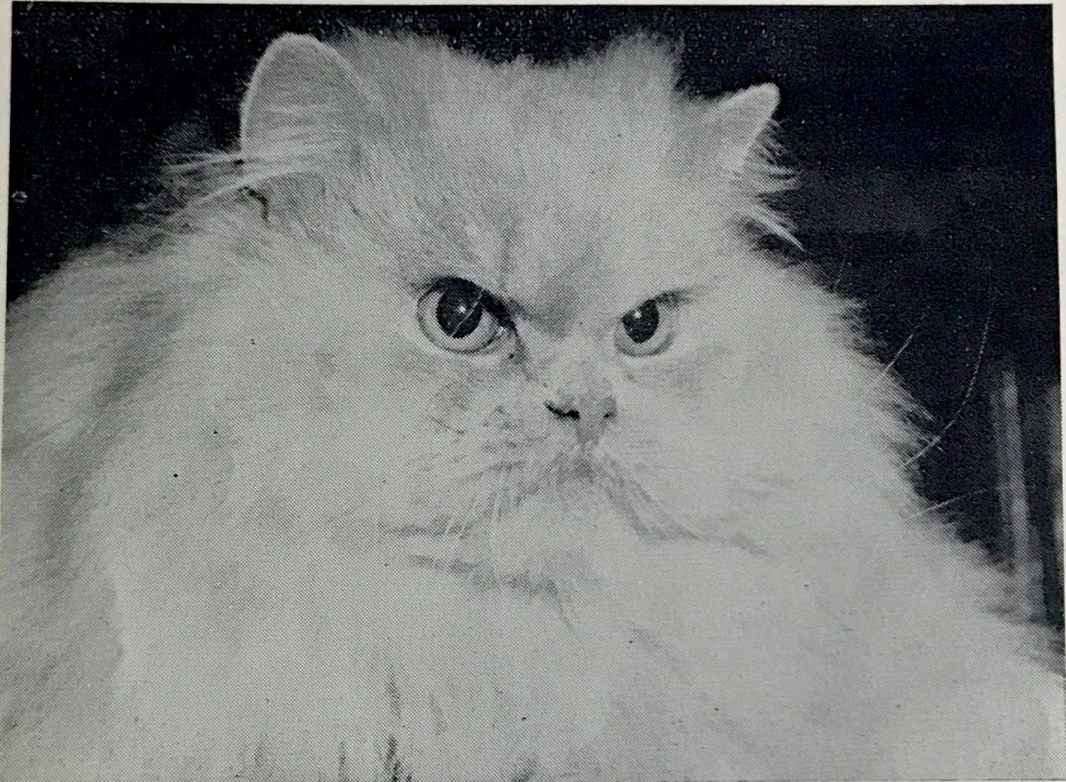

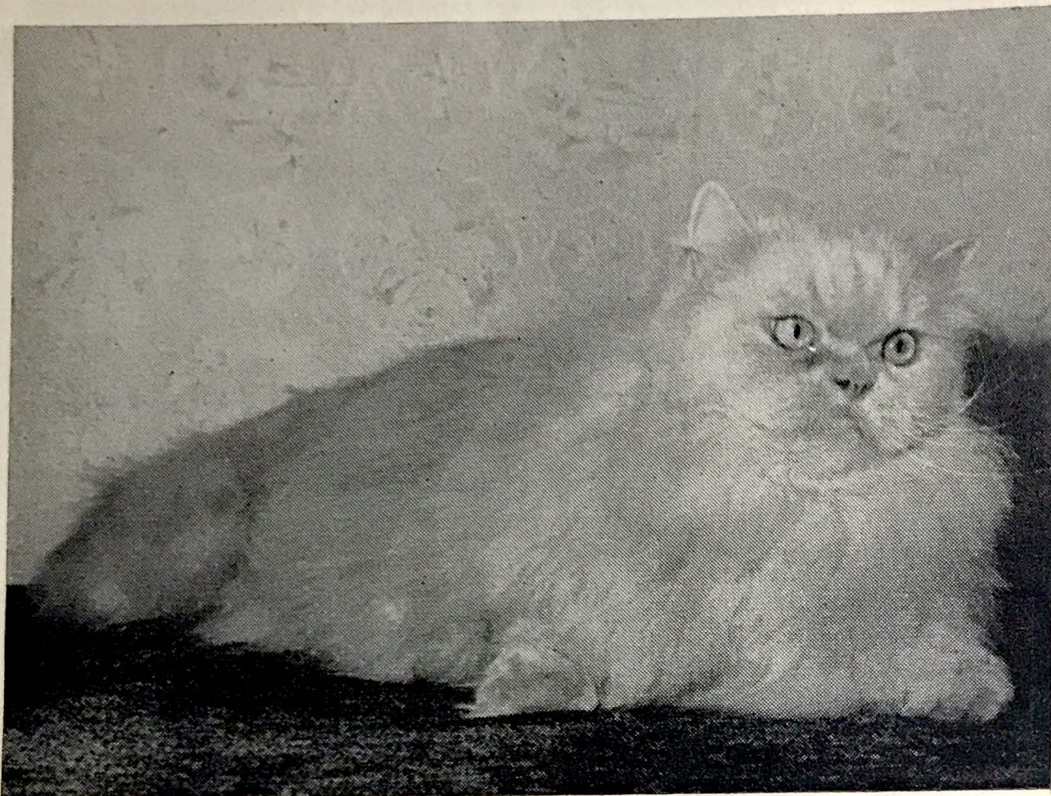

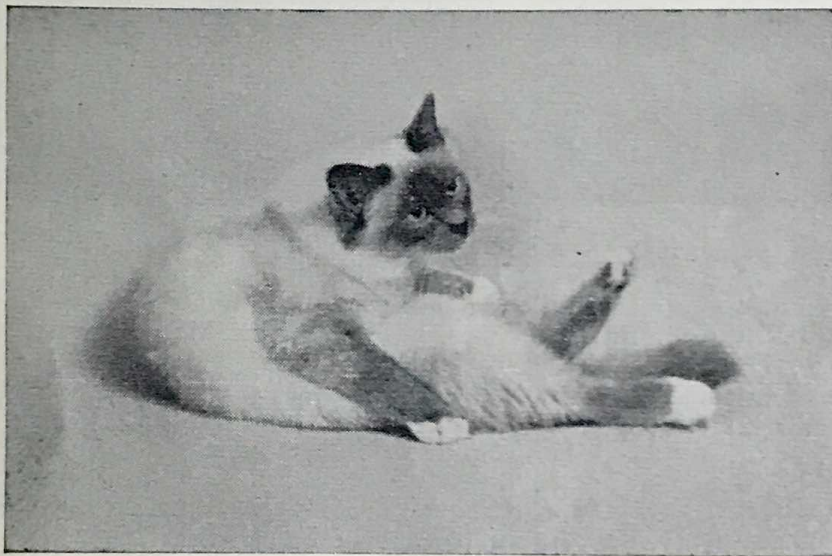

SMOKE LONG-HAIR

The Smoke should be a cat of cobby type with short legs and a broad, round head. The ears should be set well apart and the nose should be short. The eyes should be copper or orange in colour, large and round in shape and of a pleasing expression. The tail should be short and bushy. The coat should be of a silky texture, long and dense. The colour and shading are most important—the Smoke is a cat of contrasts, the undercolour being as white as possible, with the tips shading to black (or in the case of a Blue Smoke, to blue). The dark points should be most defined on the back, head and feet and the light points on the frill, flanks and ear tufts.

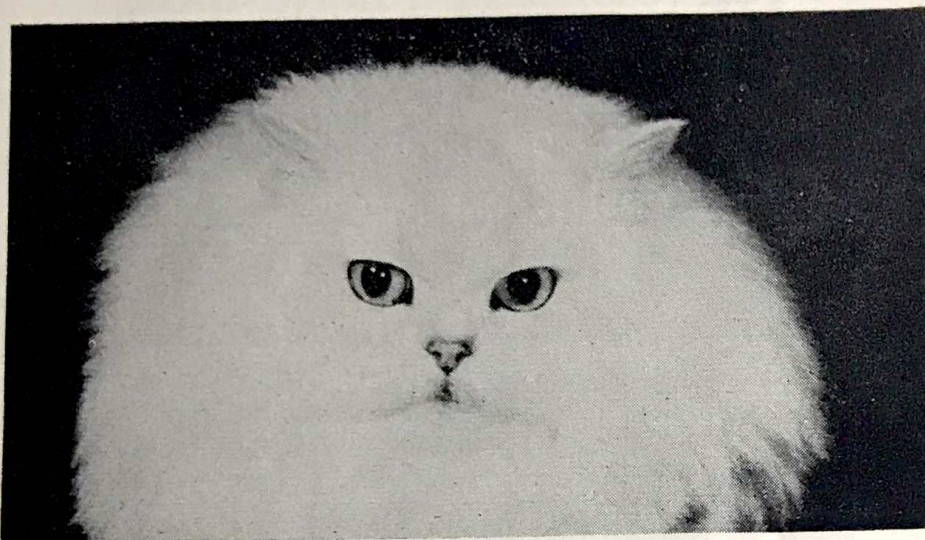

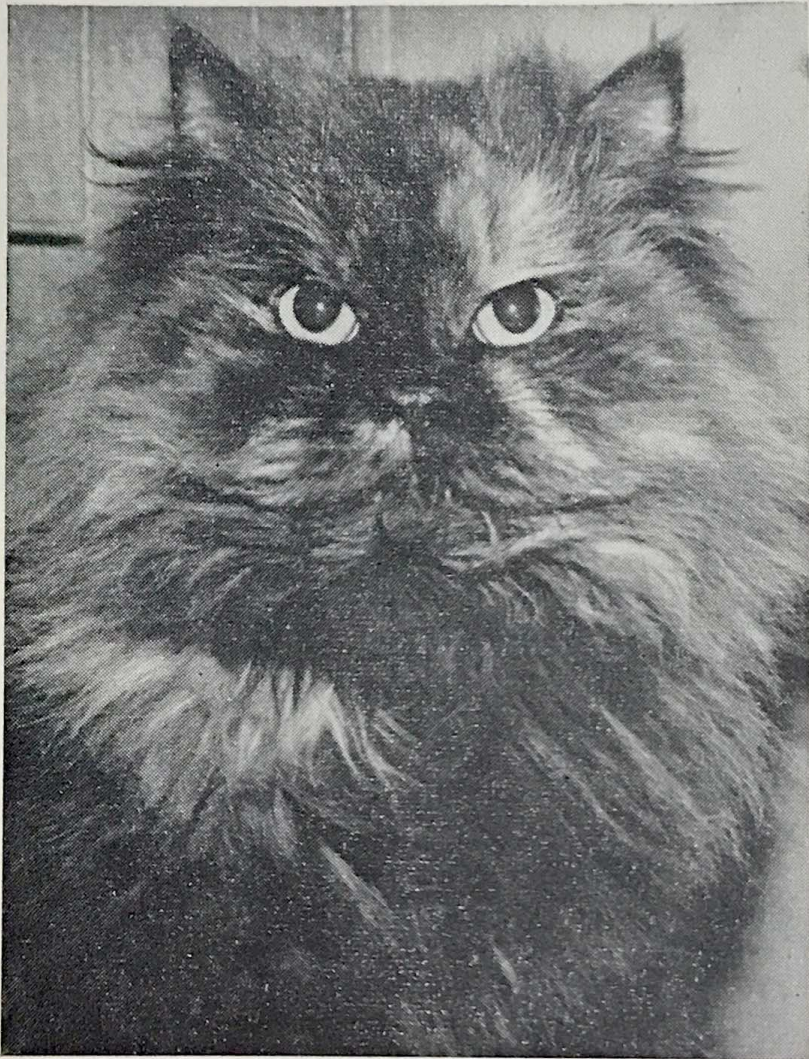

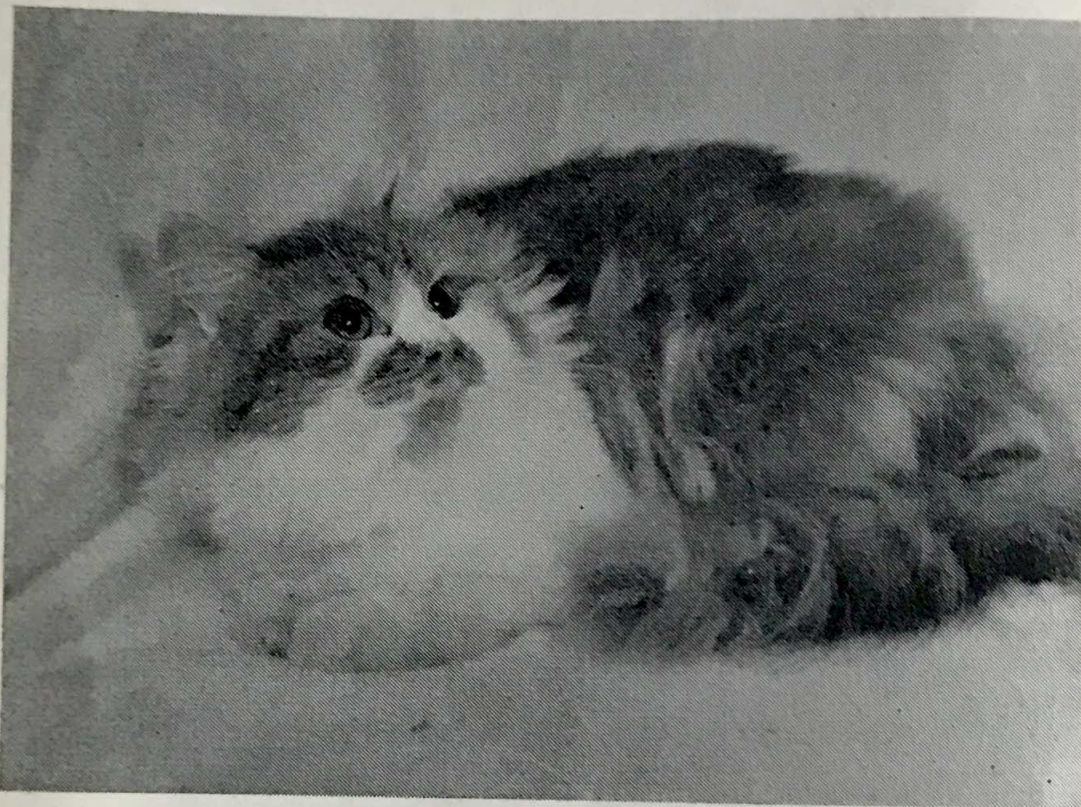

The Bi-Colour Long-Hair should be similar in type to the Blue Long-Hair, while the markings should ideally follow the pattern seen on the Dutch Rabbit. The colours may be any of those recognised in Long-Hairs combined with white. There should be no tabby or other markings in the coloured portion. Bi-Colours have been used for many years in breeding Tortie-and-Whites. Since the colour allocation in the Tortie-and-White is not so rigidly laid down there has not been a particular emphasis in breeding to the patterns now required. Therefore there are, as yet, few cats who conform exactly to the standards which are laid down as a guide for breeders to work towards.

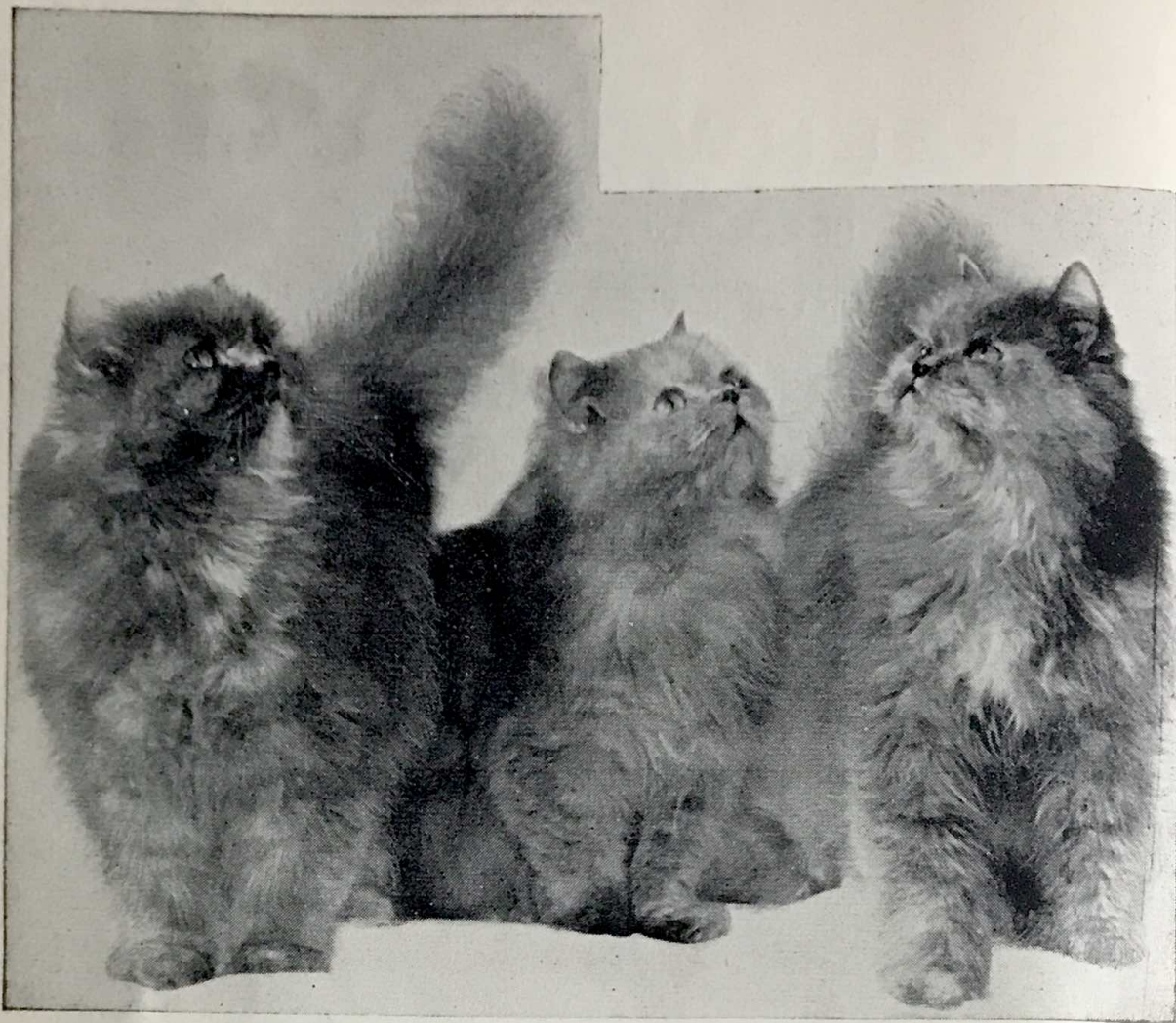

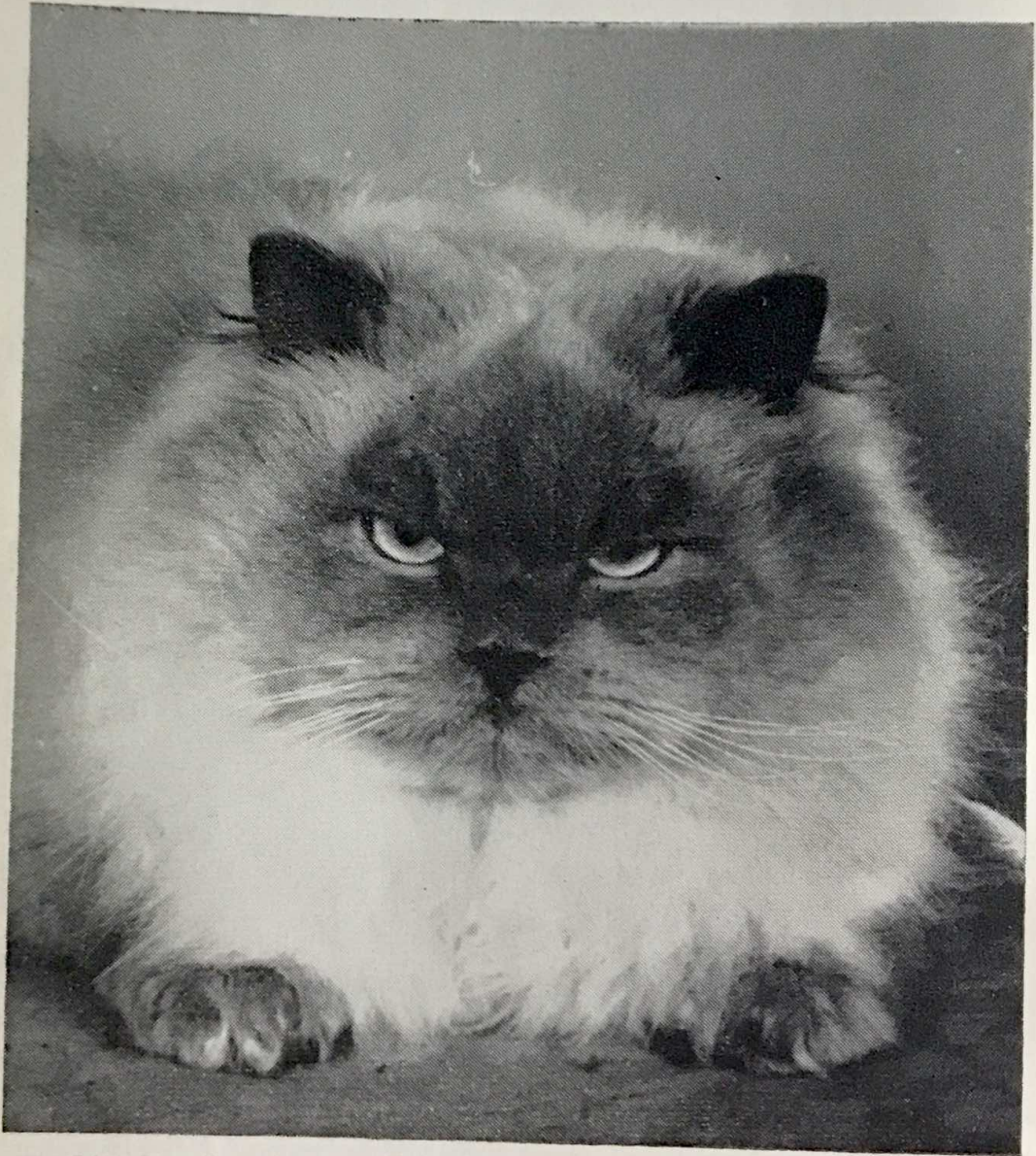

The face and nose should be short, the ears should be small and tufted, and the cheeks should be well developed. The eyes should be large, round and full and their colour should be clear bright blue, although the actual depth of tone will vary with the points colour. The tail should be short and fully furred. It should

not give the impression of tapering to a point and any kink is considered a fault. Any similarity in type to a Siamese is most undesirable. The Colourpoint should have long, thick, soft fur and should show a particularly full frill. The present standards call for Seal, Blue, or Chocolate points, but recently some breeders have been exhibiting Lilac Colourpoints and the standards will now be amended accordingly. The body colour and shading, if any, should tone with the points colour. During the summer months Colourpoints tend to be rather short of coat.

THE TURKISH CAT:

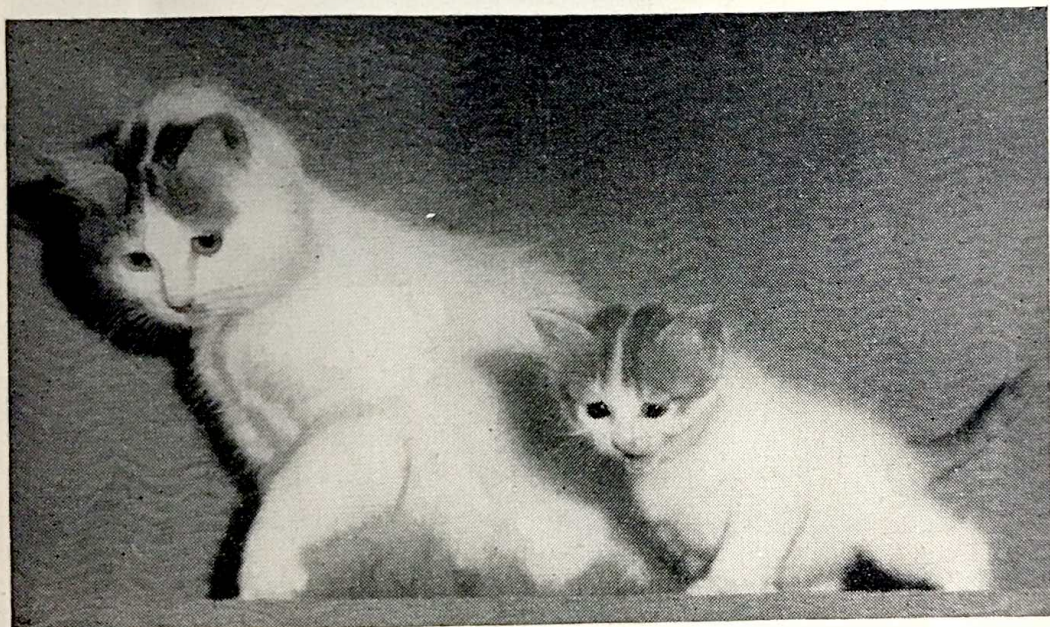
The Turkish Cat has been known for several generations in the country of its origin. It was imported to Great Britain by a perceptive fancier, who saw that its attractive appearance and unusual habits would be of great interest. The provisional standards of points have now been accepted by the G.C.C.F. and it is hoped that more of this lovely variety will be exhibited in 1967-68. The coat is quite unusual, being silky right down to the roots. There is no woolly undercoat at any time. Like most Long-Hairs, it loses its coat in the summer but carries the moult even further than most, often ending up by appearing almost Short-Hair. This excessive coat loss may be environmental and perhaps in ten or twenty cat generations the loss may be less noticeable. Another unusual feature is the colour and marking. The description of auburn for a cat has never previously been allowed, but after discussion with G.C.C.F. it was agreed that this was the only possible word to use. In type, the Turkish Cat is fairly foreign, being long in the body. Another departure from the more usual Long-Hair standards are the ears, which should be large, upright and set fairly close together.

The Turkish Cat has a sweet musical voice and is very fond of water, liking nothing better than a swim in the nearest stream or a dip in the washing-up water! The Turkish Cat is registered as Any Other Colour.

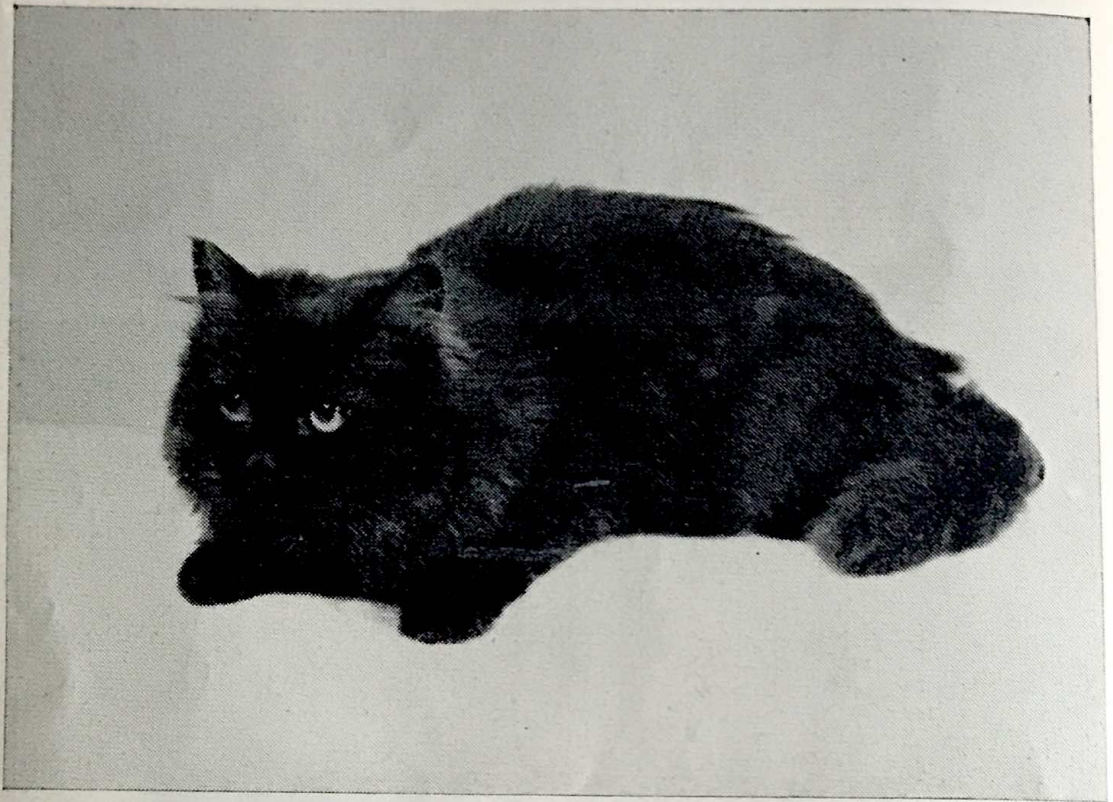

CHOCOLATE LONG-HAIR :

Breeders are aiming to produce a cat of Long-Hair type and with long hair of a chocolate-brown colour as seen in the Chocolate Colourpoint or the Chestnut Brown Foreign Short-Hair. Breeding programmes were started by the late Brian Stirling-Webb about ten years ago and he exhibited some lovely specimens at the National Cat Club Show in 1965. Chocolate Long-Hairs are registered in Any Other Colour.

LILAC LONG-HAIRS

The Lilac Long-Hair is an even newer variety than its chocolate counterpart. The aim is for the type and coat quality of the more usual colours in Long-Hair, but at the same time achieving the lilac colouration seen in the Lilac-Point Siamese and, more recently, the Lilac Colourpoint.

- 48 Mrs. S. M. Harding, MINGCHIU LILAK. Female. Born 25.11.64. Breeder, Exhibitor. Sire, Briarry Bruno (owner of Sire, Mr. Stirling-Webb). Dam, Mingchiu Snuff.

Lilak is the first Lilac Long-Hair and is the result of a ten-year breeding programme. She is dam of Chocolate Long-Hairs and Chocolate Colourpoint by the young Chocolate Colourpoint Mingchiu Romeo. Her sire is a Chocolate Long-Hair.



CAMEO CHINCHILLA

Cameos are new breeds to Great Britain, although they are recognised varieties in other parts of the world. The American standards are very detailed, listing SHELL CAMEO, SHADED CAMEO and CAMEO SMOKE. In Britain, the aim has been to consolidate on type before breeding the variety of colours and patterns within it. Shell Cameo corresponds to the Chinchilla and it is a Cameo Chinchilla that is on exhibition today. Shaded Cameo corresponds to Shaded Silver, while Cameo Smoke corresponds to Black or Blue Smoke.

The American Standards for Shell Cameo are as follows :

Undercoat white, the coat on the flanks, head and tail to be sufficiently tipped with red to give the characteristic sparkling cameo appearance. Face and legs may be very slightly shaded with tipping. Chin, ear tufts, stomach and chest white. Nose leather and rims of eyes rose. Eye colour brilliant copper.

In England, Cameos are registered as Any Other Colour L.H.

Christabel is sired by a Cream carrying blue out of a Chinchilla. She conforms exactly to the American standards of markings for Shell Cameo, although in England we call her a Cameo Chinchilla. The first few generations in a Cameo programme are invariably more cream than pink.
