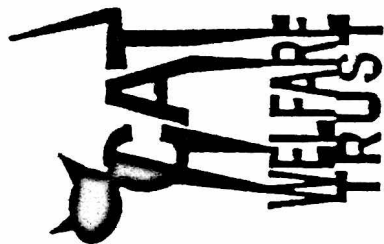

ringworm research project

THE SKIN DISEASE resulting from ringworm infection is often mild and localised; in some cats it can become severe and/or generalised at times involving secondary bacterial infections and causing considerable distress to the cat. Some of these infections prove very prolonged and can be extremely difficult to cure.

THE RISK OF SPREAD OF INFECTION TO MAN is of considerable importance as the disease, particularly in children, can be very severe. Concerns over the risk of infecting children may result in the euthanasia of cats in some households.

CATS WITH RINGWORM SUFFER from the loneliness of prolonged isolation, the unpleasantness of long periods of medication and the discomfort of shaving and bathing, which is often necessary.
