Three projects have been completed so far, all of which have been funded because the subjects were of particular interest to pedigree cat owners and

were not likely to attract commercial funding in their initial stages.

The first of these was a Ph.D. research project to study the preparation of a vaccine for ringworm and was undertaken by Ann Robinson at Bristol University Veterinary School. The second - the Genome Project was undertaken by Dr Matthew Binns of the Animal Health Trust and resulted in the identification and analysis of 211 markers on the feline genome map. The third - a study into feline chronic gingivostomatitis - was carried out by Kitty Healey at the University of Liverpool. Chronic gingivostomatitis is a condition familiar to many cat owners, this is a very painful disease affecting the gums and mouths of pet cats causing inflammation and ulceration and there is currently no cure for this condition. Kitty's research has established a link between this condition and FCV reinforcing the need for regular vaccination. Kitty's thesis summary can be seen on the GCCF website.

The current project is a study being conducted by Bristol University in conjunction with Manchester University and the University of California-Davis into the genes that play a pivotal role in the control of infectious diseases particularly Feline Infectious Peritonitis. The study should also objectively determine relative levels of inbreeding in various breeds and whether the gene pool is dangerously narrow putting specific breeds at increased risk of inherited disorders and disease susceptibilities. Results of this latter part of the study should supplement the information available to the BACs when they look at their breeding policies and help encourage best practise.

AWARDS AND SPECIALS

Supreme Best in Show: Supreme Certificate

This will give the title, for all time, of Supreme Champion/Premier. The Certificates awarded to the Supreme Adult and Neuter will count as a Challenge/Premier Certificate if the cat is not yet a Champion/Premier, but will count as a Grand Challenge/Premier Certificate if the exhibit is a Champion, Premier, Grand Champion or Grand Premier. It will count as an Olympian if the cat is already an Imperial Grand Champion/Premier. It will count as a UK Grand Challenge/Premier Certificate if the exhibit already holds a UK Grand Challenge/Grand Premier Certificate. The Supreme Kitten will also be awarded a Certificate to commemorate the win and the title of Supreme Kitten. The honour of winning Supreme Exhibit will not count towards any title.

Best of Variety: Supreme Best of Variety Certificate

This will count as a Challenge/Premier Certificate if the exhibit is not yet a Champion/Premier, but will count as a Grand Challenge/Premier Certificate if the exhibit is already a Champion/Premier or Grand Champion/Premier and an Imperial Grand Champion/Premier Certificate if the exhibit is already a Grand Champion/Premier. This will count as an Olympian certificate if the cat is already and Imperial Grand Champion/Premier. No cat will be awarded an additional UK certificate. A Best of Variety Kitten will also be awarded a Certificate to commemorate the win, but this will have no other value.

Imperial Grand Champion / Premier Classes: UK Grand Challenge/Premier Certificate.

Grand Champion / Premier Classes: Imperial Grand Challenge/Premier Certificate - no countersignature needed.

Champion / Premier Classes: Grand Challenge / Premier Certificate – no countersignature needed.

Pre-Champion / Premier Classes: Challenge/Premier Certificate – no countersignature needed.

Assessment Classes: Merit Certificate – no countersignature needed.

Imperial Grand Mastercat: UK Grand Mastercat Certificate.

Grand Master Cat: Imperial Grand Mastercat Certificate – no countersignature needed.

Mastercat Class: Grand Mastercat Certificate – no countersignature needed.

Pre-Mastercat Classes: Mastercat Certificate – no countersignature needed.

There will be three overall BIS winners, for the Supreme Non Pedigree, Supreme Pedigree Pet and Supreme HP Kitten.

GCCF ROSETTES

Supreme Adult, Supreme Kitten, Supreme Neuter, Supreme Non Pedigree, Supreme Pedigree Pet and Supreme HP Kitten.

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Show is held under the Rules of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and is open to all. As a copy of the Rules is NOT included with this schedule, all exhibitors are reminded that they should read Section 4 of the Show Rules, as they will be strictly applied. Ignorance will not be accepted as an excuse for a breach of the Rules. (Copies of the Rules may be obtained from the GCCF Offices, 5 Kings Castle Business Park, The Drove, Bridgwater, Somerset TA6 4AG).

REGISTRATION

PEDIGREE SECTION: All Cats, Kittens and Neuters exhibited at a GCCF Show must be registered. Cats registered on the Reference Register may not be shown in competition. To be effective for entry all registration and/or transfers must have reached the GCCF Office at least 10 days prior to the show. No Cat or Kittens, entire or neutered, born after 19.10.71, with one or both parents, grandparents or great grandparents unregistered shall be eligible for entry into Open Classes.

Exhibitors are responsible for the correct description of the exhibits and for entering them in the correct classes. Please do not omit to Read and Sign the declaration – if joint owners, both must sign the form.

Cats which are not normally resident with their registered owner should be transferred into the ownership of their keeper if they are to be shown. Exhibitors are reminded that in the event of rejection, all exhibits in the same registered ownership may also be rejected and clearance may be required for both households.

HOUSEHOLD PET SECTION

Please carefully read the instructions in the Household Pets Section of this schedule. All Household Pets over six months of age must be neutered.

GENERAL NOTES FOR THE ATTENTION OF ALL

The Supreme Show Committee reserve to themselves the right to:

Appoint other judges should those advertised be unable to fulfil their engagement, and to appoint further judges should they be required. Fix and limit the number of exhibits at the show.

To accept or refuse exhibit entry without giving reason.

Cancel, amalgamate or divide classes.

Publish a catalogue of the show containing information as to the exhibits and names and addresses of exhibitors.

Retain a percentage of the entry fees to cover essential expenses, in the event of the show being cancelled for any reason.

Refuse admission into the Show hall without giving a reason.

Make an administration charge for any cheque returned unpaid by the bank. The exhibitor's entry will be withdrawn from the show until such time as the entry fees plus an additional £10.00 administration charge are paid by that exhibitor. No further personal cheques will be accepted from that exhibitor.

GENERAL GUIDELINES ON ENTERING SHOWS

Where possible, always complete your show entry form from your GCCF registration document (i.e. Registration or Transfer Certificate) for the cat that is to be exhibited, printing the details carefully to avoid any misinterpretation of your handwriting. If the document, you have is headed 'APPLICATION FOR THE TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP OF REGISTERED CATS' this means that the cat is not registered in your name and you must complete the form and send it back to the GCCF with the transfer fee as soon as possible. It must be received by the GCCF no later than 10 days before the show.

If you have not received your registration document at the time of entry, complete the show entry form with the details from the pedigree, giving the first choice of name if it is a non-prefix registration, and put RAF (Registration Applied For) or TAF (Transfer Applied For), or both, in the Registration No. box It is wise to enclose a stamped self-addressed acknowledgement postcard with all registration and transfer applications, particularly for cats entered for shows, so that you know that the application has been received by the GCCF.

Try to keep a copy of your entry form - then, when you receive registration details and number, check these against the entry form and notify the Show Manager in writing of any differences in the details, as well as giving the registration number, if applicable. This may not be in time for the printing of the Show Catalogue, but the Show Manager should attach your letter to your entry form which will save unnecessary notification of discrepancies when the show is checked. All Catalogue errors are checked against the original entry form and any exhibitors' letters are used for reference. Show management are permitted to accept corrections, at their own discretion, up to the close of the show (on show day). Any such correction must not be an addition or substitution of any exhibit for which proof of entry cannot be validated or a change of exhibitor/owner. If you are entering several cats from your household and the registered owners (exhibitors) differ within that household/family, check with the Show Manager whether using one entry form is acceptable or not, and if it is, indicate very clearly which exhibitor owns which cat, ensuring all owners sign the entry form. It may be less confusing and more acceptable to the Show Manager for each owner to use separate entry forms, but joint owners of an exhibit(s) should always use the same form and both must sign.

GCCF Rules Section 4 Rule 26 - Exhibitors are reminded that the decisions of the judges are final. Any attempt to influence such decisions, or to identify a cat or ownership of a cat to a judge at a show before that judge's engagement has been completed may render the offender liable to disciplinary action.

STATUS OF ERRORS - WHAT TO EXPECT MINOR ERRORS

These warrant a notification for your reference if the error occurs more than once and it is apparent that registration details were available at the time of entry, or before the date of the show. Continuous repetition of the same error after notification will be referred to the Board of Directors. Examples of minor errors include:

Spelling errors

Separation of cat's names that should be one word, and vice versa

Administrative/breeder's prefix omitted from, or partially incorrect name given for exhibit

Overseas title preceding the name of an exhibit, sire or dam etc.

Full breed number known but not given

Sire and Dam reversed or named incorrectly

Breeder joint when single and vice versa

INCORRECT DATE OF BIRTH

This is usually classed as a minor error unless it affects an entry into classes based on age groups, when it could warrant disqualification of the exhibit from such classes; but if the incorrect date of birth affects the age suitability as a whole, then the exhibit will be disqualified from the show. N.B. AGE LIMITS: Kittens - not less than 4 months and under 9 calendar months on date of show. Adults - not less than 9 calendar months on date of show.

INCORRECT NAME OF EXHIBIT/OWNER/BREEDER

If registration/transfer details were obviously available at the time of entry or before the date of the show, disqualification is inevitable.

The following discrepancies are those which usually arise:

EXHIBIT

* Totally incorrect name.

REGISTERED OWNER

- * Joint when they should be single and vice versa EXHIBITOR.
- * Declaration not signed by registered owner/s.

N.B. The exhibitor(s) must be the registered owner(s) of the cat and not necessarily the person who actually takes the cat to the show. BREEDER

* Totally incorrect name or names N.B. The breeder of a cat is always the registered owner of the dam on the date of the cat's birth.

REGISTRATION/TRANSFER NOT RECEIVED BY GCCF 10 DAYS BEFORE THE DATE OF THE SHOW

These entries will be disqualified. Remember, the effective date of all registrations and transfers is the first date of valid receipt by the GCCF, and if you enclose your own stamped addressed acknowledgement card with your application form this will be stamped with the GCCF Office date of receipt.

TRANSFER OF EXHIBIT FROM EXHIBITOR TO A NEW OWNER RECEIVED BY GCCF MORE THAN 10 DAYS BEFORE THE DATE OF THE SHOW Entries such as these will also be disqualified as the exhibitor's entry form becomes invalid.

INCORRECT OR INELIGIBILITY OF CLASS ENTRY

These will be disqualified from the class concerned - so always check with the Show Manager if in doubt about which class to enter. If a breed number is changed officially, it is important that you notify the Show Manager immediately. Exhibits entered into title classes must have qualified on or before the published closing date of the show and the title must have been claimed in writing. Exhibitors who enter title classes without claiming will be reminded once, but if the title remains unclaimed the cat will be disqualified from this class at subsequent shows.

CATS REGISTERED ON THE REFERENCE REGISTER

No cat registered on this Register is eligible to be shown in competition and therefore these entries will be disqualified. The only exception to this is when a new breed becomes recognised; and then, cats of that breed may be shown even if they are registered on the Reference Register as long as this was the only reason for the Reference registration. Exhibitors may appeal against any disqualification resulting from show checking, giving their reasons. The appeal will be referred to the Executive Committee if considered valid and, if not, a letter of explanation will be sent to the exhibitor(s). The above advice, however, is aimed to keep your show entries trouble-free, not to mention the show checking.

VETERINARY

Exhibits will be received at the entrance to the show hall from 8.00am until 9.45am on the morning of the show. Exhibits must arrive at the show hall in a suitable, secure container (top-opening recommended) and must be accompanied by the owner or the owner's agent. If a cat cannot easily be removed from the carrier, it will not be vetted in/judged, such as for Best in Show. (N.B. This recommendation relates to the amendment to Section 4 Rule 6).

Each exhibit will be examined by the Club's Honorary Veterinary Surgeons, who are authorised to exclude any exhibit they consider unfit. No exhibit may be penned before being examined. Exhibitors passes will be issued at vetting in – there are no tallies. All cats exhibited at shows held under GCCF rules must have a current certificate of vaccination against FIE, FVR and FCV ("cat 'flu"). The full course, or booster, in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, must have been completed more than seven days before the show. The certificate must have been issued by a veterinary practice/hospital and the last vaccination entry signed by a Veterinary Surgeon or by a listed Veterinary Nurse under the direction of a Veterinary Surgeon. Certificates should be available at vetting -in and should be properly completed and clearly indicate the identity of the exhibit and the owner to avoid confusion.

Cats with an invalid vaccination certificate will be rejected under Section A. Cats unaccompanied by a vaccination certificate will also be rejected under Section A unless the exhibitor undertakes to provide proof of vaccination, valid for that show, by sending the certificate to the GCCF Office within seven days of the show. Failure to do so will lead to disqualification from the show and the cat's name will be placed on the rejection list until proof of vaccination is received in the Office.

A current certificate of vaccination is one which is not more than seven days past the manufacturer's recommended interval between boosters. Please note that HOMEOPATHIC VACCINATION cannot be accepted, under GCCF Rules, for the purpose of vetting in.

Exhibits must have clean ears and coats free from pests. Any exhibit rejected by the Veterinary Surgeon must be removed by their owners and entry fees are forfeit. If in the Veterinary Surgeon's opinion it is desirable, all other exhibits from the same cattery and the owners shall be debarred from attending the show. The Veterinary Surgeon's decision is final.

Section 5 VETERINARY SURGEONS rule 3.

a) All cats exhibited at shows held under GCCF rules must have a current certificate of vaccination against Feline Calicivirus (FCV), Feline Herpes Virus (FHV) and Feline Panleukopenia * (FPV).

The full primary course (first set of vaccinations) in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, must have been completed more than seven days before the show.

b) Booster vaccinations against FCV, FHV and FPV must be given at the manufacturer's recommended intervals. Where a variable interval of 1-3 years for FCV and FHV is recommended the minimum interval applies. ie all cats attending shows MUST receive annual booster vaccination against FCV and FHV.

For Boosters only note: Exhibitors are advised to leave at least a week between a booster vaccination and show attendance to allow the vaccine to take effect and in case of any adverse reaction. * Previously termed Feline Infectious Enteritis.

VETERINARY REJECTIONS

Exhibitors whose cats have been rejected at shows should note the following points:

When sending a clearance certificate to the GCCF Veterinary Officer please include your copy of the rejection slip. Do not send certificates by recorded delivery as this can cause delays in receipt. If acknowledgement of receipt is required, please enclose a stamped addressed postcard for signature acknowledging receipt. Exhibitors should not attend shows until they have received a letter accepting and confirming clearance from the Veterinary Officer.

NEW RULES COM 1ST JANUARY 2017

Any cat which cannot be handled safely for examination will be rejected. NB. Exhibitors must trim their cat's claws, if necessary, prior to the show. Section 5: rule 4e. Cats which show obvious signs of lack of attention to hygiene, have sharp untrimmed claws, or in the opinion of the veterinary surgeons are in an unfit condition for show, must be rejected under Section A of the Veterinary Rejection form. Note: Exhibitors should be allowed the opportunity to trim claws prior to a rejection, but should not expect the veterinary surgeon to do this for them at vetting-in. (Amended 15.06.2016).

PENNING OF EXHIBITS

Sprays must not be used in the hall as spray mist persists in the air and can irritate cats' mucous membranes. Therefore exhibitors are advised to use other means (eg wipes) to disinfect pens before penning cats. If owners wish to bring their own diluted disinfectant, small squeezy bottles which produce no spray are permitted. All disinfectants must be approved for safety and efficacy in cats eg Trigene. Every exhibit must be provided with a sanitary tray and clean plain white or near-white blanket or blankets without distinctive marking or edging, which may be arranged in such a manner as to assist the comfort of the cat. Cellular blankets are not allowed, but white Vet -bed or like material may be used if preferred. A hot water bottle or heat reflecting material or a cool pack may be used, provided they are covered by a blanket in accordance with GCCF rules. Any other form of heating will lead to disqualification. All exhibits must have water, but food containers must be removed when judging commences at 10am, and may not be returned until 12.30pm. One small toy may be placed in the pen after the time announced for the admission of the public. Judges are instructed to pass any pen that is distinguished in any way, other than official notices or award cards. No written or printed matter may be placed on competitive pens - For sale signs are NOT permitted! Exhibition pens only, may be decorated and may carry printed matter relating to the exhibit. Exhibits actually received into the Show Hall cannot be removed without the sanction of the Show Manager. They are only received on condition that the Society shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to exhibits, boxes or baskets or in any other way. Please Note that it is the Exhibitors responsibility to ensure that their cat's pen is safe and secure before leaving the hall. The Show closes at 5pm or earlier at the Show Managers' discretion. No cat may be removed from its pen before this time. Any exhibitor interfering with or removing any cat from its pen during the show, except with the consent of the Show Manager, will forfeit any award that may be due to his or her exhibit.

NEUTERED KITTENS

Exhibitors are advised that they must notify the Show Manager if a kitten entered in the show as an entire is neutered before the show takes place, even though re-registration or change of class may not be necessary. This is important because if the kitten is male, the judge could refuse to judge the exhibit or withhold an award for cryptorchidism.

JUDGING AND JUDGES

Judging will commence at 10.. Judges are empowered to withhold any prize, award or certificate in any class if the exhibits do not, in their opinion possess sufficient merit. Prizes will be awarded from the Judge's award slip and not from any catalogue or prize card. A Judge's decision is final. An exhibitor may not approach a Judge, nor enter into conversation with a Judge, until that Judge's engagement is complete.

ADVICE TO EXHIBITORS AS FROM 1.6.92

You are advised against purchasing any shampoos that change a cat's coat colour or the use of Stress Remedies including Scullcap or Valerian which change a cat's normal appearance or physical reaction as this is forbidden at GCCF shows and will lead to disqualification under Section 4 Rule 14.

Any person whose cats have been rejected under sections C or D must not officiate as a judge or steward, or in any other capacity which requires the handling of cats at shows, until a clearance certificate as required by the GCCF has been obtained.

Queens who are pregnant, lactating or who have kittened within 12 weeks of the date of the show may not be shown.

The use of small battery driven fans in pens can be dangerous, and could also be considered a distinguishing feature.

The use of any kind of spray in the hall is strictly forbidden.

Please note that in addition to the classes you have entered, your cat(s) may also be handled for the purpose of assessing candidates in the GCCF appointment scheme.

The GCCF Rules now require all cats attending GCCF Shows to have all the nails clipped on all four paws. The reason for this is to reduce the risk of injury to everyone handling cats on show day. (Since 22/02/2017).

Owner's Liability: Please note that Exhibitors (Owners) are responsible for the cost of any veterinary treatment required by their cat/s during the Exhibitor (Owners) absence from the Show hall.

Details from entry forms may be processed by computer.

Advertisements: Exhibitors are advised that advertising the future attendance of their Cat(s) at any GCCF show could lead to disciplinary action and great care should be taken when advertising in magazines, newspapers, newsletters or on the internet.

The GCCF Veterinary Sub Committee wish to remind Exhibitors that cats should not be left in cars.

SHOW WITHDRAWALS AND ALTERATIONS

The last date for withdrawal of a cat from a show is the advertised closing date for entries at that show. After this date the cat/s concerned may not be withdrawn from the catalogue of the show and the 13 day Rule about entering two shows within 13 days will apply. There will be no refund of entry fees if the cat is not present at the show and the entry in the catalogue must not be withdrawn. This ruling does not prevent Show Managers from returning entries after the closing date of the show if they are unable to accept them into the show because the show is full. ALL WITHDRAWALS MUST BE IN WRITING.

ALL ALTERATIONS AND/OR ADDITIONS TO ENTRY FORMS MUST BE MADE IN WRITING TO THE SHOW MANAGER

No telephone alterations and/or deletions will be accepted. Corrections to your entry form can be made on show day.

If a kitten is entered as an entire and then neutered before the show, the exhibitor must notify the show manager as soon as possible.

CORRESPONDENCE

All correspondence must be accompanied by a s.a.e. if a reply is required.

Any complaint related to the show must be forwarded to the Show Manager within seven days of the show.

NOTICE OF CHANGE

An announcement on the GCCF website of any alterations or additions to this schedule or in the regulations shall be deemed sufficient notice.

Show Manager's Welcome

Well here we are again, a year has simply flown by and another Supreme show is upon us. Changes have taken place at all GCCF shows this year with some amalgamations and groups replacing sections. The number of cats currently been shown generally is considerably less than in the heydays of cat shows. Entries of over 1,000 + cats are gone and sadly I don't see them returning any time soon.

We are not alone in this respect, the Cat Fancy in most other parts of the world and many other hobbies have also seen a decline in interest and the membership of their respective clubs and activities, particularly the lack of younger people getting involved. I think the only clubs that seem to be thriving are allotment and gardening clubs, as people opt to grow their own.

Having said that nobody likes change, myself included and it would seem the lower entry numbers is largely due to the restructuring and amalgamation of classes. Entries were encouraging in the first few days but then it became clear that there were those who were going to boycott the show in protest and were encouraging others to do the same so in the end the entry was not as good as hoped



even when, after listening and responding to feedback, the UK classes were put back to how they were last year.

However things did pick up and although in the end we didn't make the same number of entries as last year the quality and selection of cats here today is one which will be an absolute feast for any cat lover. As the named show manager I certainly feel the pressure but am grateful that I am not responsible for every aspect of the show as my predecessors were. John, the Supreme committee and myself meet regularly to discuss everything and decisions are made, not always unanimously but irrespective of personal views, we go forward together in the belief (rightly or wrongly) that what is decided is the best path for the Supreme show.



YES! PROGRAMME



CHOOUT GCCF Our Proud Heritage & Future Innovation revisited

The first official cat show was held at the Crystal Palace, Sydenham, on Thursday 13th July 1871. The show was such a success that the Directors of Crystal Palace arranged for another to take place in December of the same year and the cat fancy was born. As we approach the 150th anniversary of that first show it is good to reflect on how our interests, views and attitudes have changed and to consider what the cat fancy might look like in the future.

Just because something has worked for some time does not mean that it will continue, nor that there is not a better way of doing it. Since the late



19th century there has been a revolution in the way we regard our cats and why and how we keep them. Then pedigree cat ownership, breeding and showing was the preserve of the wealthy privileged classes, other people, if they kept a cat, did so mainly out of habit or to control vermin. Cats were then much more vulnerable to disease and feline veterinary medicine was primitive, uniformed and often uninterested in addressing the needs of cats, who were regarded as of little value and disposable when compared with much more valuable farm animals or dogs.

During the 20th century things began to change, people in general became more affluent and pedigree cat ownership became popular among a greater proportion of the general population. The GCCF was established in 1910 to provide a central register for pedigree cat breeds and to license cat shows, ensuring all followed a common format and set of rules. The cat fancy grew swiftly between the two world wars as did the number of shows – during the 1920s there was a cat show somewhere almost every week of the year, and the early breeds – the Persian, British Shorthair, Siamese and Abyssinian - became well established and increasingly popular as pets.



War took a great toll on the hobby during the 1940s when many breeders stopped breeding and shows were virtually non-existent for five years. Many thought that the end of the Cat Fancy had come with veterinary surgeon's sickened by the thousands of cats they had to put down as families were split up, children evacuated and men called up. Famous studs and queens were neutered and very few people had pedigree kittens for sale.

Yet the cat fancy did survive, with the first post war show held late in 1945, people's thirst for

normality and the hobbies they'd enjoyed in the past saw cat breeding and showing gain an even greater popularity as the UK moved into the second half of the century. During the period up to the 1980s the number of new breeds, cat clubs and shows increased rapidly, by the mid-80s there were over 80 clubs affiliated to GCCF. New breeds such as the Burmese, Oriental, Korat, Turkish Van, Norwegian Forest, Devon and Cornish Rex, and latterly Maine Coon, Ocicat, Exotic and Asian to name only some, added to the range and variety of pedigree cats available. Registration numbers began to outgrow the rather informal structures of the GCCF, which still relied on a few registrars working from home and using index cards to record every pedigree kitten registered. Modernisation was long overdue and a major investment was made by clubs and GCCF in the establishment of a central office and computerised register during the four years from 1983-87.

In the twenty five years that followed the number of cat clubs and breeds continued to grow (there are now over 150 member clubs), but little was done to invest in further modernisation of the IT systems, registrations processes and practices, or in the



structure and governance of the organisation itself. It was as the GCCF prepared to celebrate its centenary in 2010 that the realisation grew that we needed to once more make a major step-change in the way we operated, registrations had started to decline and finances were less secure. It was time to put our organisation on a more business like footing if GCCF was to continue to be viable organisation in the 21st century.

Over the past seven years GCCF has become an incorporated not-for-profit company, built two valuable commercial partnerships, which have helped to grow its turnover, invested in a new bespoke IT system based around on-line access to all its services, and raised its profile and influence nationally as a body working for the long-term welfare of cats. The way people live, keep their pets and the attitudes they have towards animal welfare have all changed significantly since the 19th century, if GCCF is to remain not just relevant,



but central to the world of pedigree cats, it must take a much more proactive role and provide a lead in setting the standards all should aspire to in the breeding and keeping of cats.

The availability of much more scientific information on cat genetics and on both genetic based and infectious disease, has broadened our knowledge and understanding and allows us to use tests, vaccines and other interventions to demonstrate we are highly responsible and caring cat owners.

We now have in place clear policies on breeding for genetic health, on refusing recognition to breeds which cannot enjoy a normal healthy life, and are looking to provide a voice for pedigree cats within all aspects of the cat world. Working with other cat charities, food manufacturers and even with politicians and government agencies to ensure pedigree cat breeds are understood, treated fairly and valued in society.



The expectations of the wider public with regard to animal, and specifically cat, welfare has also changed. GCCF needs to be able to respond to that, and to have a strong voice that is listened to, if we are to ensure that our precious hobby is properly understood and we are to be acknowledged as a responsible and ethical organisation.

To achieve this we must continue the work we have started, to educate people about our breeds and to counter views that they are unhealthy or that our breeding practices do not prioritise the health and welfare of all the pedigree kittens registered with us.

We must work to ensure the popularity of cats as pets continues, and that we promote good cat husbandry and proper understanding of cat behaviour and how to meet the full needs of our pets while pursuing our busy, sometime hectic lives.

Today's society is used to instant access to information and services available 24 hours a day so GCCF needs to

step up a gear with swift turn-around times on everything from registrations and transfers through to requests for information or advice. It needs to broaden its horizons further and offer a wrap-around service to the wider cat fancy, be it to owners, breeders, exhibitors, show managers, judges, or the general public interested in owning a cat. Good communication and customer service are key as is being open to new ideas and opportunities.

We also need to encourage young people into our hobby, making it attractive and relevant to their lives, as they will ultimately ensure its future. This is the primary focus of our plans, both short and long-term.

We have our own scheme in place, called YES, where young people aged 8 to 16 learn how to care for cats and show them. They also learn about stewarding and working behind the scenes in running a show, with the hope that some will become the next generation of breeders and judges.

As an organisation we will continue to invest in the steady on-going development of all our services and look to build in the flexibility to meet changing priorities and demands. We cannot afford to rest on our laurels, instead we need to constantly question the way we do things, to look for better, more cost effective, more interactive ways of operating.

Good communication is the key, so please do support us in this work and help us make the GCCF the responsible, ethical, highly regarded organisation you deserve it to be.


CUDDLY TOY FUN COMPETITION

2018 has seen a lot of changes being made to the GCCF. Inarguably one of the greatest has been the reimagining of the sections under which the various GCCF recognised breeds are shown. This will have far reaching consequences going forward into our future, way beyond the acquisition of show titles, as Kate Kaye,

Chair of the BAC/Judge Training/Show

Review Group explains.

Section Review

The Cat Fancy both in the UK and worldwide has come a long way since its inception in late 19th century with the GCCF leading the world.

Recognition that domesticated cats, like dogs, play a role within the human psyche beyond that of a purely useful exterminator drove vermin realisation that if dogs and horses could



be recorded, have illustrious family trees and be paraded before fellow admirers then so could Cats! It was this belief that ultimately led to the development of the GCCF as an organisation able to provide services for cat lovers similar to those provided by the Kennel Club for dogs. It still remains the largest, best known and most respected feline registering body in the UK.

In the fledgling days of cat showing the devotees paraded their beloved cats on leads but eventually moved to using pens in which the cats could be exhibited safely and easily seen by visitors without the cats getting upset. Over the years a system of judging at the exhibits pens with training undertaken on a breed by breed basis evolved.

In the 1920's there were approximately 10 recognised breeds – there are now over 40 recognised breeds for the purpose of showing. These breeds being classified and allocated to a "section" by breed origins or type. Originally there were three main sections - Persian/British/Siamese - and any "breed" that did not fit into these categories went into what is now thought of as the foreign section.

Over time sections for Semi-Longhaired/Burmese and Oriental breeds were introduced, driven by their

popularity at that moment in time however the ever-changing demographics of breed popularity combined with changes in technology and society's engagement with the ever-increasing growth in alternative leisure activities has led to fewer people wishing to engage in what is an expensive, time consuming and, at times, heart-breaking hobby even though the demand for pedigree cats remains strong. This has had a knock-on effect in that fewer cats are being shown and less people, who are both available and willing, to take on roles of responsibility such as Show Management, Judging and Committee membership.

It was with this history that was at the forefront of discussions, the aim of which was to develop a programme of change that would ensure that GCCF remained relevant within the worldwide cat fancy and the society it finds itself functioning in today.

It was quickly realised that the longstanding sectional and class structure framework, given the growth in breeds eligible for showing had created an inequality of opportunity to gain higher titles, notably in the Semi Longhair and Foreign sections. This, combined with the protracted system of training a judge, which has remained largely as it was when developed in the 1920's – with Judges still training breed by breed with the time taken to become a judge of any one breed being around 2 to 4 years on average, showed that this

method of training and sectional breed division could no longer be considered as effective or efficient systems. These discussions also highlighted that GCCF are also experiencing a diminishing coterie, of full and Pupil Judges; of all the recognised breeds available to undertake judging engagements, with an apparent decreasing interest amongst breeders and exhibitors to become a GCCF Judge so it was very clear that these issues need to be addressed and overhauled. After considerable consultation with interested parties, number crunching and investigation into other feline registry's approaches to show organisation and judge training, it was realised that all of these elements were interlinked and it was going to be a much larger undertaking than had originally been envisaged, to ensure that all elements were examined and, where necessary, improved. Consequently, following numerous discussions and consultations, a new structure of sections and classes offered at shows was agreed and implemented in June 2018.

It was also felt that to continue to give these sections a "Breed" title was incorrect as any upcoming breeds, when recognised, are allocated to a "section" according to their basic body structure and/or the similarity of their genetic background to other breeds within a section hence the headings have been changed to the impartial word – Section.

Now that an updated structure of sections and classes are in place, the committee can consider how best to train Judges through a more efficient process while retaining and ensuring that in-depth knowledge of breeds encountered is not lost.



A Guide to Modern Day Cat Show Titles

This photo shows a full Pedigree Silver Egyptian Mau (Mau ns 24) aged around 2.5. This cat is now a UK & Imperial Grand Premier



In order to understand the titles available and awarded to the top show cats for the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy, it is first necessary to understand when a cat is termed a "KITTEN", "ADULT", "NEUTER", "PEDIGREE" then "NON-PEDIGREE" or "PEDIGREE PET".

In show terms a young cat is termed a KITTEN until it reaches the age of 9 months. Kittens may be neutered before they reach 9 months, but they will continue to be shown in the kitten classes until they reach that age. In show terms

a cat is termed an ADULT when it is still entire, so these cats will typically be the breeding cats - studs (males) and queens (females).

In show terms a cat is termed a NEUTER once it has been neutered/spayed/desexed. Neuters still retain their gender just not the ability to reproduce.

In show terms a PEDIGREE cat is one who meets the required Standard of Points (SOP) for their breed which governs such things as size, shape, colour, pattern, of the cats body, coat (including length, feel, resilience, curl), eyes, ears, head, feet, tail etc. along with their disposition and temperament. No cat is ever described as perfect, but each breed will have faults listed. Cats which closely match their breed standard are the ones which are likely to win the highest titles.

In show terms a NON-PEDIGREE is a cat which has no pedigree ancestors anywhere in its genealogy. In non-show terms the cats are usually described as a moggy or domestic shorthair. In show terms a PEDIGREE PET may either be a "full pedigree" with or without "papers" (papers being the term used to describe a formal written pedigree or lineage of the cat along with a certificate of birth or mating certificate), such as a rescue cat or a cat which does not conform to its breed standard (for whatever reason) or a cat which is the result of a whoops litter (such as a queen escaping and mating with the local Tom). Both these types of cats form the HOUSEHOLD PET SECTION of a cat show.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF BREED STATUS

The GCCF currently recognises 35+ different types of cat breeds. For a breed to be fully recognised by the GCCF will grant it what is known as Championship status – meaning the show cats for that breed can compete against each other and other full status breeds as per the rules of the section they are shown under for titles. Breeds/patterns or different colours of an existing breed, who have yet to clear through the genetics committees and meeting various other criteria are known as those granted preliminary status. This means

they may be shown at GCCF shows in Assessment classes, with those cats of sufficient qualities being awarded Merit Certificates. A "New" breed/colour/pattern will have a number of these to win or collect before it can progress onwards. Breeds which just have their name recognised, may be shown at GCCF shows but only on Exhibition "with critique" only. Meaning they'll get a judges thoughts on their new breed but no placements is yet possible. Cats that are on Exhibition Only may not enter into competition only so cannot win the Pedigree section of a GCCF cat show. Cats entered for Merit and by default Best of Breed certificates do have that opportunity.

DIFFERENT TYPES OF SHOWS

Many years ago the clubs which make up the GCCF would be eligible to hold either Exemption, Sanction and Championship shows depending on the status of the club/society/association and how long it had been around. Exemption shows are now a thing of the past, but there are still a few Sanction shows, which, while affiliated to the GCCF they do not offer any titled certificates apart from "Merits" needed for new breeds.

However Sanction shows aside, there still remains two types of Championship shows (those offering titles) and they are known variously as ALL BREED, BREED and SPECALIST shows. An ALL BREED show, is, as the name suggests a show which will cater for all 6 pedigree sections as well as the Household Pet Section. A SPECIALIST show as usually catering for more than one breed (but does not covering all breeds). A BREED show is a specialist show catering for only one or two different breeds, plus the Household Pet Section, though it's not compulsory.

For all titles gained up to the Olympian Level, cats may gain their certificates from any mix of Breed or All Breed shows. For the Olympian Level there is a different rule, whereby at least 4 of the certificates, per level must be gained at ALL BREED shows.

The Supreme Cat Show — as the GCCF's flagship show, and the only show run by the Governing Body itself, and not by a constitute club/association or society — has its own titles and set of rules.

CATS IN THE PEDIGREE SECTION

Kittens cannot win any titles at a Championship show, though they may win Best of Breed, in their Breed Classes and even entire sections or PEDIGREE SECTION of the show. Titles do not start until the kittens graduate into the Adult and Neuter classes at the age of 9 months.

Adult cats, both entire and neutered, are eligible to win Certificates if their Breed is at Championship Status. These lead to the award of official titles, a list of which is published quarterly. With the exception of Merit Certificates, Certificates are only awarded at Championship Shows. Winning a Breed, Grand, Imperial or Olympian class does not guarantee a Certificate as these are only awarded if the judge considers the cat to be of sufficiently high quality.

PEDIGREE CERTIFICATES FOR FULL BREEDS AT EITHER A BREED OR ALL BREED SHOW

When understanding the titles awarded to Pedigree Cats it's necessary to understand that there is a direct comparison like for like between the awards given to Adult cats and those given to Neuters. There is a one word change and a different certificate colour for awards up to the level of Olympian (of any level).

Adult cats are awarded gold coloured "CHAMPION" certificates with first none, then red, then purple coloured bands. Neutered cats are awarded silver coloured "PREMIER" certificates with first none, then blue, then purple coloured bands.

THE OFFICIAL GCCF TITLES FOR PEDIGREES ARE:

Champion (CH), Grand Champion (GRCH), Imperial Grand Champion (IGRCH) - for Adults

Premier (PR), Grand Premier (GRPR), Imperial Grand Premier (IGRPR) – for Neuters Olympian Bronze (OB), Olympian Silver (OS), Olympian Gold (OG) – is used for both Adults and Neuters

PATHWAY TO THE TITLES AT A CHAMPIONSHIP ALL BREED OR BREED SHOW:



CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES

These are awarded to the first prize winners of entire Adult Open classes for full (championship) status breeds, both male and female.

THREE Challenge Certificates awarded by three different judges make the cat a Champion/Premier.



GRAND CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES

At ordinary Championship shows, full Champions may compete in special Grand classes for Champions only. The winner of each Grand class is eligible to be awarded a Grand Challenge Certificate. The second placed cat is eligible for the Reserve Grand Challenge Certificate: this means that if the Grand Certificate winner is disqualified, the Reserve Certificate winner will be awarded the Grand Certificate, which will count towards a title. No further placings are made in these classes, even if the certificates are withheld.

THREE Grand Challenge Certificates awarded by three different judges make the cat a Grand Ch/Pr.



IMPERIAL GRAND CHALLENGE CERTIFICATES

At ordinary Championship shows, Grand Champions compete in Imperial Grand classes. The winner of each Imperial Grand class is eligible to be awarded an Imperial Grand Challenge Certificate. The second placed cat is eligible for a Reserve Imperial Grand Challenge Certificate: this means that if the Imperial Grand Certificate winner is disqualified, the Reserve Certificate winner will be awarded the Imperial Grand Certificate, which will count towards a title. No further placings are made in these classes, even if the certificates are withheld.

FIVE Imperial Grand Challenge Certificates awarded by five different judges make the cat an Imperial Grand Champion/Premier.



OLYMPIAN BRONZE, SILVER & GOLD CERTIFICATES

Imperial winners can aim higher still and compete for an Olympian Certificate. These cats will compete against other Imperial Grand Champions or Imperial Grand Premiers with just 4 certificates offered per show, as males and females compete separately in each category. In pursuit of an Olympian title, bronze, silver and gold levels can be obtained. A cat must win 4 of the 5 certificates needed for each level at All Breed Shows, (one may be at a Breed Show) and all 5 of the certificates at each level must be awarded by different judges.

the next FIVE certificates by five different judges at this level an Olympian Silver, with the remaining FIVE certificates by five different judges at this level an Olympian Gold.

The first FIVE Olympian Certificates awarded by five different judges make the cat an Olympian Bronze,

ADDITIONAL CERTIFICATE BEST IN SHOW WIN

Any Adult or Neuter cat who wins Best in Show will be awarded another certificate to the value of the title they are currently trying for, or the next progressive level up in the case of the cat being made up on show day. It is worth noting that this counts as a BREED Show certificate for the Olympian titles not and ALL BREED show.

PEDIGREE CERTIFICATES FOR FULL BREEDS AT THE GCCF SUPREME SHOW

The GCCF show has its own set of higher certificates and awards. The first of these is the UK Grand.

UK GRAND CERTIFICATE

Historically the UK Grand was first introduced in 1987 at a time before the Imperial and Olympian awards were issued. Then the ceiling was the Grand Champion/Premier titles won at the Championship shows. Cats may be shown every 2 weeks under GCCF rules, and at that time the UK was introduced most shows were hosted by single clubs/societies/associations, not doubling up of breed and area clubs as they sometimes do now. Several years ago it would take a truly excellent cat several months if not a year to gain the titles of Champion or Grand Champion despite the frequency of shows. In recognition of the fact that the UK Grand was introduced as the pinnacle of the Show world Titles. It sits in front of any title other than that of the "Supreme" and is always suffixed by an "and" — so UK & Imperial **** or UK & Grand **** or even UK & Olympian ***.

SUPREME CERTIFICATES

The Supreme Adult, Kitten and Neuter are each awarded a Certificate.

If the Supreme Adult is not yet a Champion, this Supreme Certificate will count as a Challenge Certificate. If he or she is already a Champion it will count as a Grand Challenge Certificate. If the cat has already been awarded a UK Grand Challenge Certificate, it will count as the second UK Grand Certificate, giving the cat the title of Supreme UK Grand Champion.

If the Supreme Neuter is not yet a Premier, this Supreme Certificate will count as a Premier Certificate. If he or she is already a Premier It will count as a Grand Premier Certificate. If the cat has already been awarded a UK Grand Premier Certificate, it will count as the second UK Grand Certificate, giving the cat the title of Supreme UK Grand Premier.

Whether the cat is a Champion/Premier, Grand Champion/Premier or UK Grand Champion/Premier, the awarding of the Supreme Certificate adds "Supreme" to the title - Supreme Champion, Supreme UK Grand Premier etc.

The Certificate awarded to the Supreme Kitten is a commemorative certificate does not count towards any future title, but the exhibit may put "(Supreme Kitten followed by the year)" after his or her name in catalogue entries and on pedigrees.

PATHWAY TO THE TITLES AT THE SUPREME SHOW



UK GRAND CHALLENGE/PREMIER CERTIFICATES

At the Supreme Show only, there are special classes solely for Imperial Grand Champions/Premiers, UK Grand Champions/Premiers, UK & Imperial Grand Champions/Premiers and Olympian Imperial Grand Champions/Premiers, again split male and female. The winners are eligible for UK Grand Challenge Certificates, two of which, awarded by two different judges, make the cat a UK & Grand Champion/Premier or UK & Imperial Grand Champion/Premier if the cat has additional gained that title. There is no Reserve UK Grand Challenge Certificate.

TWO UK Grand Certificates awarded by two different judges make the cat a UK Grand Champion/Premier.

AT THE SUPREME - BEST OF VARIETY CERTIFICATES

At the Supreme Show, each Best of Variety Winner, Adult, Kitten and Neuter, is awarded a Certificate. These certificates can be used to the place of a certificate for the title the cat is hoping to gain.

If an Adult is not yet a Champion, this BOV Certificate will count as a Challenge Certificate. If a Neuter is not yet a Premier, this BOV Certificate will count as a Premier Certificate. If the Winner is already a Champion, the BOV Certificate is considered to be a Grand Challenge Certificate. If the winner is already a Premier, the BOV Certificate is considered to be a Grand Premier Certificate. If the winner is already a Grand Champion, or Grand Premier, the BOV certificate is considered to be an Imperial Grand Champion or Imperial Grand Premier Certificate. Any Imperial or Olympian titled cat that wins Best of Variety will be awarded an additional Olympian certificate. Kittens also win Best of Variety Certificates but these do not count towards a title.

CATS IN THE HOUSEHOLD PET SECTION

As we stated at the beginning of this article in SHOW TERMS a NON-PEDIGREE is a cat which has no pedigree ancestors anywhere in its genealogy. In non-show terms the cats are usually described as a moggy or domestic shorthair. A PEDIGREE PET may either be a "full pedigree" with or without "papers" (papers being the term used to describe a formal written pedigree or lineage of the cat along with a certificate of birth or mating certificate), such as a recue cat or a cat which does not conform to its breed standard (for whatever reason) or a cat which is the result of a whoops litter (such as a queen escaping and mating with the local Tom).

Both these types of cats form the HOUSEHOLD PET section of a show, where they are shown separately as both categories have different visual aspects and a cat show is, after all a beauty and in the case of the Household Pet section, a temperament contest too.

Beauty is in the eye of the beholder, as has been said many times, but where in the Pedigree Section of a cat show, the cats are expected to conform as closely as possible to the physical characteristics of their Standard of Points, in the Household Pet section there is no such criteria. In this section the cats are judged on Presentation, Personality, Condition and Temperament. In this section cats that have a few 'battle scars', dinks from their ears, a bent tail tip or even the loss of a limb is not enough to exclude the cat from being shown. If they've been groomed to perfection, are in the rudest of health, enjoy being handled, will purr if they're stroked and know how to win over a human admirer in 5 seconds flat – you've probably got a winner on your hands.

That said, each group of NON-PEDIGREE and PEDIGREE PET is then split into Long/Semi-Longhaired and Short-Haired Classes which are then further split for colour and pattern. Another significant change from the

Pedigree section is that ALL cats shown in the HOUSEHOLD PET section must be neutered. There is no Adult/Kitten/Neuter split — ALL 'adult' cats in the HOUSEHOLD PET section by default are neuters. If they've joined the HOUSEHOLD PET section as kittens, then they must be neutered/spayed by the time they are 6 months old. If they've joined the HOUESHOLD PET section after they're 6 months old then they must be neutered/spayed before they can be shown.

CLASS COMPARISONS

In the Pedigree section, cats are separated into sections and then into Breed Classes. For a direct comparison where there are no breeds in the Household Pet Section, the cats are separated into sections, coat lengths and then Colour Classes. In deference to the exotic colouring/coat length & textures found in Pedigree Cats, the Pedigree Pet section does have one extra Breed/Colour class available to them. So the Colour classes for NON-PEDIGREE cats are as follows:

SELF – which means any SINGLE COLOUR WITHOUT PATTERN – this can be black, white, blue, brown, ginger etc. PLUS "self" colours with white, i.e. black & white, blue & white, brown & white, red/ginger & white etc.). TABBY (any tabby pattern or colour EXCEPT red/ginger or tortie tabby, again with or without white). ANY GINGER/TORTIE/TORTIE TABBY (including ginger tabbies, again with or without white). KITTEN CLASS – Non-Pedigree Kittens regardless of colour will stay in the kitten class until they reach 9 months of age.

The Colour classes for PEDIGREE PETS is the same as for the NON-PEDIGREE cats with the ADDITION of an AOC Class. AOC stands for Any Other Colour and its into this class that all cats which are VISIBLY pointed, tipped, shaded or smoke etc. will go. This includes such breeds or look-alikes as Ragdolls, Birmans and Siamese etc. REGARDLESS OF THE COLOUR OF THE POINTS. To further define this class a Tabby Point Birman, for example, would be shown in the AOC class NOT the Tabby class, as will any tortie point etc.

Cats in this Section are entered under their normal "pet" names, NOT under any pedigree name should it exist so "Prefix" Silver Cloud who might be called "Monty" as a pet at home will be shown under the name of "Monty" in the HHP section although some exhibitors do have fun with "posh show names" as long as these are not more than 2 or 3 words long.

TITLES AND CERTIFICATES FOR NON-PEDIGREE & PEDIGREE PETS AT EITHER A BREED OR ALL BREED SHOW

Since 2009 HHPs have been allowed to compete for titles similar to those of their pedigree counterparts. Where Pedigree Adults can become "Champions" and Pedigree Neuters "Premiers" up through various ranks, Non-Pedigree and Pedigree pets alike can become "Master Cats". Their progress up through the ranks exactly mirrors the other titles available to Pedigree cats.

Since June 2017 any HHP wishing to claim a title MUST be registered. Registration is not compulsory in order to show your HP, and an already titled cat will not lose any titles gained previously, but an unregistered HHP cannot claim new titles. Titles are administered by the GCCF (our thanks go to Lesley Szwed who started the system and formerly administered it) and all claims must be sent to the GCCF. Title claim forms can be found on the Forms/Downloads page, and can be posted or emailed. All claims are acknowledged and, periodically, a list of titled cats will be published on the GCCF website. Titles are now also updated on the exhibitor's page if signed up for online services.

THE OFFICIAL GCCF TITLES FOR NON-PEDIGREE & PEDIGREE PETS ARE:

Master Cat (MC), Grand Master Cat (GMC), Imperial Master Cat (IGMC) Olympian Bronze (OB), Olympian Silver (OS), Olympian Gold (OG)

MASTER CAT CERTIFICATE

This is attained by the awarding of three Master Cat certificates by three different judges. The winning cat must have a good temperament, be presented well, be shown in very good condition and have a good personality too.

THREE Master Cats Certificates awarded by three different judges make the cat a Master Cat.



GRAND MASTER CAT CERTIFICATE

This is attained by the awarding of three Grand Master Cat certificates by three different judges. A cat at this level has to have an excellent temperament, be presented to the highest standard, be shown in excellent condition and have an affectionate and confident personality. The second placed cat is eligible for a Reserve Grand Master Cat Certificate: this means that if the Grand Certificate winner is disqualified, the Reserve Certificate winner will be awarded the Grand Certificate which will count towards a title. No further placings are made in these classes, even if the certificates are withheld.

THREE Grand Master Certificates awarded by three different judges make the cat a Grand Master Cat.



IMPERIAL GRAND MASTER CAT CERTIFICATE

This is attained by the awarding of five Imperial Grand Master Cat certificates by five different judges. At this level, the winning cat must be exceptional in every way. The second placed cat is eligible for a Reserve Imperial Grand Master Cat Certificate: this means that if the Imperial Grand Certificate winner is disqualified, the Reserve Certificate winner will be awarded the Imperial Grand Certificate which will count towards a title.

FIVE Imperial Grand Master Certificates awarded by five different judges make the cat an Imperial Grand Master Cat.



OLYMPIAN BRONZE, SILVER & GOLD TITLES

An Olympian winner must be an outstanding cat that is not only presented to perfection, have an outstanding temperament and shown in peak condition, its personality should demonstrate that extra "presence" and show quality that makes it stand out as definite "Best in Show"! The Household Pet Section is treated in exactly the same way as cats in the Pedigree Sections as far as titles and class qualifications are concerned. Therefore ONLY ONE Olympian Certificate from a Breed Show may be counted towards an Olympian Title at each level the other four must be won at all-breed shows. Any certificates won at the previous level cannot be used or count towards the title at the next level.

The first FIVE Olympian Certificates awarded by five different judges make the cat an Olympian Bronze, the next FIVE certificates by five different judges at this level an Olympian Silver, with the remaining FIVE certificates by five different judges at this level an Olympian Gold.

ADDITIONAL CERTIFICATE BEST IN SHOW WIN

Any Non-Pedigree or Pedigree Pet who wins Best in Show will be awarded another certificate to the value of

the title they are currently trying for, or the next progressive level up in the case of the cat being made up on show day. It is worth noting that this counts as a BREED Show certificates for the Olympian titles not an all-breed show.

HOUSEHOLD PETS AT THE GCCF SUPREME SHOW

HHPs also have their own section at the Supreme Show for both sections. The classes comprise Kitten, Pre-MC, MC, GMC and I GMC Classes for cats to enter at their relevant level. For the first time in 2009 HPs with the title Grand Master were able to compete at the GCCF Supreme Show to win a UK Grand Master Certificate.

SUPREME SHOW ONLY

UK Grand Master Cat Certificate.

UK GRAND MASTER CAT CERTIFICATES

At the Supreme Show only, there are special classes solely for Imperial Grand Master Cats, UK Grand Master Cats, UK & Imperial Grand Master Cats and Olympian Imperial Grand Master Cats, again split male and female. The winners are eligible for UK Grand Master Cat Certificates, two of which, awarded by two different judges, make the cat a UK Grand Master Cat or a UK & Imperial Grand Master Cat if it has additionally gained that title. There is no Reserve UK Grand Master Cat Certificate.

TWO UK Grand Certificates awarded by two different judges make the cat a UK Grand Master Cat.

AT THE SUPREME - BEST OF VARIETY CERTIFICATES

The male and female winners of each class will compete for Best of Colour and then for Best of Group with the winners going forward to compete for Best In Show. There are three Overall Best in Show winners for the Household Pet Section at the Supreme Show, the Supreme Non-Pedigree Exhibit, Supreme Pedigree Pet Exhibit and Supreme Household Pet Kitten (Kitten Class winners from both Non-Pedigree and Pedigree Pet sections). Both the Non-Pedigree and Pedigree Pet winner will subsequently be able to include the coveted "Supreme" in their title.

Additionally if the Non-Pedigree or Pedigree Pet cat is not yet a Mastercat the BOV Certificate will count as a Mastercat Certificate. If the Winner is already a Mastercat, the BOV Certificate is considered to be a Grand Mastercat Certificate. If the winner is already a Grand Mastercat, the BOV certificate is considered to be an Imperial Grand Master Cat Certificate. Any Imperial or Olympian titled cat that wins Best of Variety will be awarded an additional Olympian certificate.

28 October 2017 is a day which we will never forget! At 16:48, Riley aka IGC & Supreme UK OG IGP Cullykhan Vivaldi achieved the ultimate prize, becoming GCCF Supreme Exhibit for 2017.

In March 2015, we were showing at a TICA show. Our good friend, Angela Millican of Cullykhan Persians was there with three brown tabby and white stunning Persian kittens –

Anya, Melody and Vivaldi. We took a shine to Vivaldi instantly and joked with Angela that he'd like to live with us in Cambridgeshire. Vivaldi however was destined to go to Australia as a stud cat.





Three months later, the phone pinged, Vivaldi was no longer going to Australia and was available as a show neuter! It was only a few days before we drove up to Newcastle upon Tyne and returned with a 10 month old, adolescent out of coat Vivaldi, now called Riley.

Riley's first ever show was in September 2015. Despite him being shy to handle, he gained 2CC's and also a Best Persian – a sign of things to come! Whilst he was entire, his show career saw him gain his Imperial Grand Champion title in 5 months and also gain 2 OBIS, 6 BIS and 7 BOVs.

Riley has always had an exceptional coat nerves has been a standout, goofy character at shows.

At the Supreme in October 2016, he was close to the ultimate accolade winning Best Persian Neuter and Reserve Supreme Neuter. Riley was also Best Persian Neuter and GCCF Persian Section Winner of 2016/17.

In December 2016, Riley was joined by a new addition, Zendique Georgie Porgie, a brown classic tabby Persian kitten bred by GCCF and TICA judge Jane Allen. Georgie had good success at a few TICA shows before he made his GCCF debut at the Colourpoint Cat Club in January 2017. Not only did he gain Overall Best in Show but the Georgie fan club was formed as Georgie's good looks are matched with his sweet temperament; he's often known to give a kiss (nose rub) to his judges and fans! By the Supreme show in 2017, Georgie was a Grand

The day of the Supreme 2017 arrived and as Anna had set the pens up on the Friday, we got the cats vetted, groomed and settled without hassle. The morning passed quickly and we were delighted that both boys

gained their certificates, a UK Grand for Riley and an Imperial for Georgie plus their BOBs. The numbers in the Persian section has dwindled in recent years but the quality remains and for either Riley or Georgie to progress any further, they had formidable opposition.

Best of Variety judging started and the Persian Neuter class was first judged by Celia De Martino. After assessing each of the contenders, Celia narrowed down her selection until she picked her winner – it was Riley! Any best of variety is special but winning for a second year running was magical! Riley then took his place on Winner's Row.



Next up was Georgie! The Persian Adult class was judged by Linda Dutton. Georgie was a relative youngster aged 15 months and we were delighted when one by one cats were eliminated and Georgie was in the final three. Linda went back and forward, meticulously checking her three contenders. Georgie was on top form and showed to perfection. Eventually Linda raised her hand towards Georgie and said "It has to be this one!"


Wow... this was totally unexpected and Georgie took his place alongside Riley in the posh pens!

It was soon time for the big finale. The Supreme panel consisted of distinguished judges Val Kilby, Betty Shingleton and Shirley Bullock. The steward for the Persian section was Gloria Neale who we knew would show them off to their best advantage, so we knew we were in safe hands.

The adults were up first and after the seven were judged, all returned to the stage for the winner to be selected. One by one the cats were returned until the top two remained, Georgie and a gorgeous brown spotted tabby Oriental. After a nail biting wait, the Supreme Adult was announced, it was the Oriental with Georgie taking Reserve. We were thrilled, this

had far surpassed any expectation we had! The kitten judging passed in a daze and we were delighted when the tortie and white Persian kitten, Cullykhan Bellini was selected as Supreme Kitten. Bellini is daughter to Riley's sister Anya.

Onto the Neuters and Riley shone, his coat looking magnificent under the stage lighting. We knew however it would be someone else's day as it was unlikely that another Persian would win. Again, all seven were bought back to the stage and one by one they were returned until the top two remained. Riley was still there alongside a gorgeous Maine Coon female! Was he destined to be bridesmaid for a second year in a row? It seemed like forever before John Hansson announced the winner was the Persian! We both were in meltdown,

the pinnacle of over 30 years' worth of showing cats.

It wasn't over yet, the Supreme Adult, Kitten and Neuter were returned to the stage, two Persians and an Oriental and the judges were asked to make their selection for Supreme Exhibit. It took 2 minutes 53 seconds in total before John announced, the Supreme Exhibit was 'a Persian' ... 'a cat with white' ... 'It's the Neuter!' It's difficult to express the emotion felt but on 28 October 2017, all our dreams came true.

Both boys continue to have remarkable successes on the show bench. Riley achieved his Olympian Gold title in May 2018 and his

overall record stands at 35 BOVs, 26 BIS, 11 OBIS and 5 BOTB. Georgie achieved his Olympian Silver title in July 2018 along with 17 BOVs, 8 BIS, 4 OBIS and 1 BOTB. Two very special Persians!



Breed Profiles



Exotic Shorthair. The Exotic is a shorthair cat with Persian 'type'. They are a relatively new breed in the UK with many admirers and are happy, healthy and mischievous. With an easily maintained coat, they have quickly established themselves as both a striking show cat and a loving pet. Exotics are heavily boned, massive cats with lines softened by the thick, dense coat. The coat adds an impression of soft roundness to these muscular cats, making them look like plush toys you want to pick up and cuddle! In the UK some British SH breeders kept the "overtyped" offspring from British shorthair x Persian matings to try and develop the Exotic SH. The first import to the UK was CFA Gr Ch Purrfun My Main Man, a black smoke, descended from an original Burmese x Persian cross. The British SH was dropped as an allowable outcross for Exotics in 2000; now only Exotic and Persian are acceptable. Exotics were formally recognised by the GCCF in 1986, and gained championship status in 1995.

Persian. The ultimate glamour puss, which can be found in a huge array of colours and patterns. The Persian cat is one of our oldest breeds and evokes images of distant historical Persia and Turkey. Its long, luxuriant, flowing coat comes in a myriad of colours and its pansy-like face with big round copper. green or blue eyes is open and sweet. It has a short, sturdy body and short legs like little tree-trunks to support its massive build. Don't be fooled by their good looks! Persians are extremely intelligent and this helps them adjust easily to both the home and the show scene. They communicate with you with their expressive eyes and expect you to understand their wishes - they will also look at you incredulously when you misunderstand them; after all you are supposed to be intelligent! While the history of the Persian breed is mainly unrecorded, we do know it has been around for centuries, and the first cat shows in Britain included Persian cats. The early Persian descriptions sounded very like today's description: round head, short face, snub nose with stop, round full cheeks and a cobby body with a deep full chest.

Judge Profile

Susan Danks GCCF Judge

My day job is working as a veterinary nurse at my husbands practice. Also working in accounts for a recruitment company. I am Secretary for the United Chinchilla Association cat club.

I began showing and breeding Chinchilla Persians in the late 1980's. I was introduced to the Pewter Persian about 10 years later through a good friend Wilhelmina Burrows of Aranmount Prefix, back then the Pewters were in the early stages of recognition.

My first Pewter was from a Chinchilla x Blue Persian. After this I bred my Pewter and Chinchilla programs separately under my TAMOSAH prefix. I joined the Cameo Pewter & Smoke Society who were working with the GCCF and were also trying to gain recognition for the Blue Pewters. (this took another 10 years) I remember putting a row of Blue Pewter Persians on exhibition at the Supreme show in the late 1990's trying to gain support, and I am proud to say I bred the first Champion & Gr Ch Blue Pewter in this country.



I have worked with Willy Burrows over generations to improve the type and eye colour of the Pewter Persian, and still enjoy showing and breeding my Persians & Chinchilla's today. I started judging Persians in 2006 and have recently become a full judge of Asians and a probationer of Russians.

Judge Profile

George Cherrie (RUI Ukraine)

When I received the email from John and Linda, inviting me to return to the UK, not just to judge a cat show, but to judge the "GCCF Supreme Show", I was, to say the least, astounded. However it seemed appropriate as I begin to wind down with my judging career, that I would be returning to my "roots".

Although I have lived for the last 24 wonderful years in Rotterdam, with my husband of the last 16 years, Arie, my beginnings are very much rooted in The GCCF. From the first day that I walked into the Scottish Cat Club Show, held at the wonderful, McLellan Galleries, in Sauchiehall Street, Glasgow, in 1973, little did I realise how much my life would change, by that inquisitive visit to a cat show.

Like many, in the shortest space of time, I became totally hooked, my life changed in a flash, and from that moment forward, I would become entranced into the fabulous world of felines.



Over the following 20 years, I became involved in every aspect of GCCF, as an exhibitor, club member and club officer, council delegate, show manager and finally, a GCCF Judge. I had the privilege, to be active in the UK Cat Fancy, during what were probably the Golden Years. There were huge shows, unforgettable judges and so many wonderful characters, too many to name individually, who would all have a massive influence on me.

I was privileged to be Show Manager of the Scottish Cat Club, when we took the daring decision to move to the, then new, Scottish Exhibition and Conference Centre. Perhaps, my most memorable moment was when I was asked by Frank Grieve, the Chairman of The National Cat Club to take over, as organiser of the National Cat Show, from the GCCF icon, Grace Pond. Together with Pedigree Petfoods, and Bill King we gave the show a "new look" and for two years, we initiated changes, some that were met with gasps, but none the less, set the early roots for changes that would continue, in a small way.

I also served, under the indomitable GCCF Chairman Kay Burgess, on the earliest, and at the time highly innovative, working group, tasked with looking to "shake up" the way GCCF selected and trained it's judges. I was so fortunate to be personally able to start my early training, as a judge under so many of the truly great GCCF judges, who remain as icons in my memory, and again, their influence upon me is immeasurable. Every time I have joy of handling a magnificent example of a cat, I think back on these influential "icons", and wonder, what would they say to the beauty I have in my hands.

In 1995, after moving to the Netherlands I became an Independent Judge with one of the largest French organisations, based in Paris, the SCFF, eventually becoming an all-breed Judge. I judged extensively in Europe, and in 2005, I became an all-breed Judge with CFA, and continued to judge extensively, in many parts of North America, Europe, Russia, Ukraine, Israel and Kuwait. One of the most unforgettable experiences of my judging career has been my two invitations to judge in South Africa. I resigned from CFA in 2017 and was invited to become an all-breed Judge for RUI.

My love of cats has allowed me to visit so many beautiful and different countries, and introduced me to many new cultures, indeed, it is where I met my life partner. I have made many good, lifelong friends, but above all, I have had the privilege to handle and assess some of the most beautiful cats, in the world, something that I could never have imagined when I walked into that GCCF show in Glasgow in 1973. I have always had an adventurous, carefree spirit, willing to take, and seek risks, and that has served me well.

It is with immense honour, and a great privilege, that I look forward to judging at the very unique, and famous GCCF Supreme Show. In many ways, I see that as a "home coming" and it will, I am sure, be an unforgettable experience.

SECTION 1

The breeds in this section are all Persian in type, varying only in their coat colour, markings and eye colour or, in the case of the Exotics, their coat length. They are big, solid cats with a cobby body, sturdy legs, a short tail and a broad round head with a short nose, small ears set wide apart and large round eyes; the effect is one of roundness and substance, enhanced by the beautiful coat which should be long, dense and silky in Persians, dense and plushy in Exotics.

Group 1: BIRMAN, RAGAMUFFIN, RAGDOLL



Birman. The Birman - also called the "Sacred Cat of Burma" - is a gentle, loving cat. They are bewitching with their striking blue eyes and distinguished appearance. This pointed breed has a silky soft coat, which is light in colour. Their pale bodies and white paws offer a stark contrast with the point colour which develops on their face, ears, tail and legs, They are solidly built, medium to large cats with powerful muscles for play! The defining features of the Birman are their wonderful blue eyes and four pure white feet - the front gloves covering only the feet but the rear socks extending up behind the leg to form a long pointed gauntlet. The Birman cat is said to have acquired his stunning appearance through the intervention of a blue-eyed goddess who rewarded a temple cat's love for and devotion to his priest by turning his white coat golden and changing his yellow eyes to sapphire blue. His paws remained white as a symbol of his purity. Ever since. the temple cats have borne the goddess's marks of favour and it was said that priests who died were reborn into the cats' bodies. The Birman breed was first recognised in France in 1925 and then in the UK by the GCCF in 1966.

RagaMuffin. The breed name RagaMuffin came about because the original gene pool developed from the street cats of Riverside, California, and the M is capitalised because (according to a founding US breeder) they are big huggable, loveable Muffins! The overall impression should be one of a large, muscular, heavy cat; every possible colour and pattern is allowable. These semi-longhaired cats have a dense silky coat like that of a heavily furred rabbit and their fur grows longer around the neck and face (ruff), increases in length toward the stomach and gives a wispy frill on the hind legs. Although fairly new to the UK, their popularity is growing steadily. Related to Ragdolls, they were outcrossed to Persians, Himalayans and domestic longhaired cats to increase the size and bring about other changes in appearance to differentiate the RagaMuffin from the Ragdoll.






Ragdoll. The name "Ragdoll" is derived from the reported tendency of individuals from the original breeding cats to go limp and relaxed when picked up. The Ragdoll is a large affectionate, semi-longhaired cat with beautiful blue eyes. It has an easy, laid-back temperament and in general loves interaction with people and other animals. Anne Baker, a breeder in Riverside, California developed the Ragdoll breed in the early 1960s. In 1981 the first Ragdoll cats were imported into the UK by Pat Brownsell (Patriarca) and Lulu Rowley (Petit-Lu) from the Blossom-Time cattery in the USA the Ragdoll had arrived in the UK.

Group 2: NEBELUNG, NORWEGIEN FOREST, SOMALI LHSH, TURKISH VAN, VANKEDISI

Nebelung. The Nebelung is known as a 'creature of the mist' an elegant cat of foreign type with a dense, shimmering semilonghair coat of soft, silky texture. To the uninformed, the Nebelung might look grey but in cat show terms he is a medium blue colour all the way to the roots. Ideally, the hairs are silvertipped which makes the coat seem to glisten with a silvery sheen. The breed was founded in America with the cats Siegfried (1984) and Brunhilde (1985) owned by Mrs Cobb. The cats that looked like Russian Blues but with a semi-long coat. They were called Nebelung. The word 'Nebel' is the German word for fog (mist) and Russian 'Nebo' for sky or heaven.



Another school of thought is that the breed name was derived from



the epic German

Norwegian Forest Cat. Referred to as the "Skogkatt", the Norwegian Forest Cat has been included in Viking legend and mythology. With a wild and rugged look, these stunning cats are not just pleasing to the eye but a delight to have around too. The Norwegian Forest Cat is a healthy, robust natural breed that developed over hundreds of years of natural selection in a harsh climate. It is a slow-maturing breed that may take up to five years to reach full maturity.

The Norwegian Forest Cat (or "Wegie") is an interactive, playful, loving member of any household. Its strong, sturdy body and thick coat are testaments to their evolution over the centuries in Scandinavia. They travelled with the Vikings, keeping their ships and villages free of vermin. By the 20th century the Norwegian Forest Cat was becoming a rarity in its native land and was at risk of extinction. In the 1970s, the Norwegians put a special breeding programme in place to protect the breed - and the breed received royal recognition when the late King Olaf designated them the official cat of Norway.



Somali. The cat with the smiling face, the Somali is of medium build and foreign type. It is a beautiful cat, with a ticked coat that comes in two lengths, semilonghaired and short haired. The combination of ticked fur in a range of colours, striking facial markings, large ears and bright, expressive eyes gives the Somali a wild look which immediately captivates. The Somali is a combination of beauty and personality; a very intelligent cat, its zest for life and love of play blossom with human companionship. The semi-longhaired Somali is the longhaired version of the older style Indeed, there is a cat described as Abyssinian. "mistress of the embalming house" in the papyrus of Nespaheran, c900 BC that closely resembles a Somali. Abyssinians have always been used as outcrosses for Somalis to maintain a healthy gene pool, with the resulting short-haired kittens very attractive.

In 2011, preliminary recognition was granted by GCCF to the Short-Haired Somali and, in June 2014 they gained championship status and are shown in the Semi-Longhaired Section.

Turkish Van & Turkish Vankedisi. Commonly known as the "swimming cat", the Turkish Van is a naturally occurring semi-longhaired breed from the rugged region of the Middle East centred on Lake Van in Turkey, where the climate varies to extremes. The Turkish Van is known for its distinctive pattern - a white cat with a strikingly coloured head and tail. The 'topand-tail' markings, even when seen on other breeds of cat, are frequently referred to as "van patterning". The pure white Turkish Vankedisi has exactly the same characteristics and temperament as its van-patterned cousins. The cats first appeared on these shores in the 1950s when a pair of Turkish Vans were brought back to Britain by a holidaying couple.






Group 3: MAINE COON, SIBERIAN

Maine Coon. The Maine Coon cat is a large, semilonghaired cat, distinguished by its rectangular shape and flowing coat. The breed evolved as a working domesticated cat in a rural environment and this role is reflected in a rugged appearance with a characteristic 'weather-proof' coat and the demeanour of an alert, capable hunter. The Maine Coon cat is a gentle giant who cannot help but make his presence known in your home. Maine Coon cats are affectionate and tactile pets - always up for a cuddle; they are intelligent and can be taught to fetch, walk on leads and open doors. The Maine Coon originates from the state of Maine in the USA. In the 1850s seafarers brought longhaired cats back from foreign parts and these cats mated with the local shorthair cats. The offspring were big, strongly-built cats with semi-long coats and brush-like tails that resembled the tail of the racoon, hence the name Maine Coon. The cats developed thick, dense coats to withstand the extreme Maine winters.

The Maine Coon is now known throughout America. It was imported into the UK in the 1980s and gained full GCCF recognition in 1993.

Siberian. The majestic Siberian is a strong, built powerfully cat with strong hindquarters helping them jump exceptionally high. They are a slowmaturing breed, reaching full magnificence at about five years of age. Siberians are large cats with a substantial rounded body reminiscent of a barrel and heavily boned legs to support the body structure. Their paws would do a heavyweight boxer proud! However, for all their powerful strength, these are gentle cats that enjoy playing and clowning around with their families. Siberian cats have a sweet chirruping voice and an impressive purr. Siberian cats have existed for a long time; the earliest known reference is from 1000 AD. It was not until 2002 that the first Siberians put their paws on British soil. Since then, the number of breeders in the UK has increased very quickly as word spreads about this wonderful breed.

Judge Profile

Sarah Johnson (FIFe GB)

I was introduced to the Cat Fancy when I decided to purchase a Siamese kitten. This turned into the purchase of two kittens and those immortal words "have you thought about showing?". A regular visitor to the National Cat Club Show at Olympia since I was a very small child (remember the "Blue Peter" Classes?), I could hardy comprehend taking part in such a thing, but when our family discovered a show just a few miles away we found ourselves entered and so the story began!

Our GCCF Prefix "Landican" was granted in the mid '80's (held jointly with my mother, Pat Norman, until her death in 2017) and were fortunate to have bred and owned some wonderful cats over the years – UK G rPr Fleic Joe Ninety; Ch & Gr Pr Landican Storm Bird; Gr Ch Landican Storm Warning; Gr Pr Landican Pepin amongst them. Always wanting to do something "different", we bred and owned the first Cream Oriental Gr Ch – Gr Ch Landican

Cream Cracker and the first double titled Oriental Red
– Gr Ch & Gr Pr Landican Firebird. We also dabbled with other colours, including a "silver pointed" litter in 1994.

In 2004 we achieved the ultimate goal, to introduce to the UK the Oriental Bicolour. The breed received permission to be shown in 2006, with full recognition in 2010 and we were lucky enough to have bred the first Merit Winner with Landican Bispecialorder, and then to have the first Champion and Gr Ch in Inlay Joop van Scalindjo. I decided to change direction a little in the early 2000's and joined FIFe where I trained to become a judge, qualifying for Siamese and Orientals in 2008, Semi Longhair in 2011, and Persians & Exotics in 2014.

Nowadays, I live in rural North Devon with two delinquent sheep, and breed and show Exotic Shorthairs with some success, concentrating on high-white patterned cats. I have a keen interest in genetics and have served on the FIFe Breeding & Registration Commission. I am currently Show Commission Chairman for Felis Britannica. Outside of the Cat Fancy I have a passion for anything equine-related and for F1 Racing. I watch every race — friends know not to disturb me when the race is on!



Judge Profile

Arie Groenewegen (RUI Ukraine)

I was born in Rozenburg, the Netherlands, which is a small village just outside, Rotterdam, one of the Netherlands largest cities. I always had a very strong interest in all animals, however I had a particular affinity with cats and birds, quite a combination. From a very young age I spent a great deal of time rescuing injured wild birds, and my home became a makeshift sanctuary, much to the disapproval of my mother. After moving to Rotterdam, I was finally able to begin my journey to discover the fabulous world of Pedigree Cats. Little did I realise at the time, but this would take over my life for the next 40 plus years.

I was initially attracted to Persian cats, but this was later to be expanded to cover a variety of breeds, including Abyssinian, British Shorthair, Oriental and Siamese, under my prefix of "Golden Rainbow". I was constantly looking for new challenges, and towards the end of my active cat breeding programs, I was extremely involved in the early beginnings of the Exotic breed in Europe in the late 1980's.

I enjoyed considerable interest during a long show career with the varied breeds I showed, and gradually became involved in



the varied world of show and club management. I was a member of the NOK, which was the organisation that brought together the various Independent Cat Clubs that had become so popular in the Netherlands. We formed a close working group of clubs, standardising the format of our shows, formulating our breed standards and shows, and I played an important role, within The NOK, establishing the training and examination protocols used to appoint our Independent judges, following a very strict procedure for Judge Examinations both theoretical and practical.

It should be pointed out, at this time, the Independent Cat Clubs in the Netherlands, relied heavily in these formative years, on judges being invited from the GCCF, and indeed, the Independent Cat Club standards, established by the NOK, were greatly influenced by The GCCF standards, and, indeed my own training as a judge, was under many famous GCCF Judges. I qualified as an Independent judge, firstly of Persian cats in 1982, and in a short space of time, I found myself travelling throughout Europe, gradually increasing both my knowledge and experience as a judge and increasing my judging qualifications to include Siamese, Oriental, and the many other shorthair breeds eventually becoming an all-breed judge.

In 2005, after having been one of the very first CFA "Guest" Judges at the early European CFA Shows, for a number of years, I was encouraged to apply to become an accredited CFA judge, and was initially appointed as an Approved LH/ SH judge, and shortly afterwards as a full, all-breed CFA Judge. I remained with CFA until my resignation in December 2017, after which time I became an all-breed judge with RUI. During my judging career, I have had the privilege to handle so many outstanding cats of many different breeds. I have travelled, extensively throughout Europe, judging several times in the UK and have judged at many memorable shows in Russia, Ukraine, Israel and Kuwait. I have also judged throughout North America, from the East to West coasts of the USA. I suppose, to date, one of the highlights of my judging career was the invitation to judge in South Africa, not only because of the wonderful cats I had the honour to judge, but the breath-taking beauty of the country itself.

I feel incredibly honoured to be returning to the United Kingdom and being invited to judge at The Supreme Show. I look forward, with great enthusiasm, to judging many of the United Kingdom's finest cats.

This is one of the earliest semi-longhair breeds to be recognised. Although, like the Persian, it should be massive and well-rounded, the body, legs and tail are a little longer than in the Persian and the ears slightly larger, while the nose is straight and of medium length. The eyes are almost round and must be a deep blue. The coat is long and silky. The unique characteristic of this breed is its white feet, the front feet having white "gloves" to cover the toes and the hind feet white "gauntlets" covering the paws and tapering up the back of the leg to the hock.




Chartreux. A robust natural French breed with a long history, it is one of the few breeds that comes only in blue. Chartreux are calmly attentive to the world, and tend to sit back and observe before making a decision. It is a tolerant and gentle breed with a passionate devotion that defies their robust frame. Legend has it that the Chartreux's ancestors were feral mountain cats from what is now Syria, brought to France by returning crusaders in the 13th century. The country adopted the breed and stories of the "Blue cats of France" began during the 16th century, describing it as a stocky cat with a woolly ash-grey coat and copper eyes valued for its ratting ability. After WWI, French cat breeders became interested in preserving this ancient cat and started rebuilding the breed from rare existing colonies. Early breeders put together a breed standard based on 18th century naturalists' descriptions and the breed today has changed

BRITISH LH & SH, CHARTREUX, MANX, SELKIRK REX

British LH & SH. A quarter of all kittens registered with the GCCF each year are British Shorthairs, making the British the most popular pedigree cat in the UK. The British is a patient, relaxed soulmate. forming strong bonds with human companions of all ages and being tolerant of other pets such as dogs and rabbits. Whilst not overly talkative, your British will take a great interest in the family routines and will make sure that he is always on hand to ensure things are done properly and on time! British kittens have an adorable teddy-bear quality, which combines with a comical and affectionate personality. Slow to mature, the calm and easygoing British shorthair cat deserves his place as number one in the hearts of the British family. When progressed the British Longhairs will join this section.

Manx. The Manx cat, in earlier times often spelled Manks, is a breed of domestic cat originating on the Isle of Man, with a naturally occurring mutation that shortens or entirely eliminates the tail. Manx are prized as skilled hunters, and thus have often been sought by farmers with rodent problems. A strong preference for them as ship's cats is thought to be responsible for the world-wide spread of what originated as a very limited, insular island-based breed. Manx cats walk and run with a normal gait, but exhibit a well-documented Manx 'strut', due to the longer more powerful back legs. They are extremely fast and very impressive jumpers. Many Manx have a small stub of a tail, but Manx cats are best known as being entirely or nearly tailless; this is the most distinguishing characteristic of the breed, along with elongated, strong hind legs and a rounded head. Manx cats come in all coat colours and patterns, though all-white specimens are rare, and the coat range of the original stock was more limited.

Selkirk Rex. The Selkirk Rex is an easy-going, relaxed cat that resembles a soft, stuffed toy that you just want to pick up and hug. The largest of the rex-coated (curly) breeds, Selkirk Rex have a tousled disarray to their dense coats that makes them look as though they are having a bad hair day! Sometimes called the cat in sheep's clothing, these gentle cats bring a smile to your face. They are plush-coated, medium-sized cats with solid boning and bodies that fill your arms when you pick them up for a quick hug and cuddle. The first Selkirk Rex cats arrived in Britain in February 2002; they were three siblings bred in Austria. Their popularity was immediate and they soon became a regular sight at cat shows. These are loving, patient cats reflecting the temperaments of the breeds used to develop the Selkirk Rex. The British Shorthair contributed the laid-back personality, the Persian added the cuddly nature and the Exotic Shorthair brought an impish playfulness to the package.

Kate Grice "The British Shorthair was the breed that the Cheshire Cat was based on."


Judge Profile Andreas Kretschmer-Kraiczek (WCF Germany)



Breed Profiles



Group 1: ABYSSINIAN, KORAT, RUSSIAN, SINGAPURA, SNOWSHOE, THAI

Abyssinian. The Abyssinian is one of the top five most popular cat breeds world-wide. It is a medium to large shorthaired cat with a lithe and muscular feel. One of its defining features is a distinctly ticked coat, showing at least four bands of colour. The Abyssinian is a delight to look at with its large ears, sometimes with tufts, resembling a lynx, its large rounded almond shaped eyes and beautiful face markings, all of which combine to give a wild but gentle expression. Nothing about the Abyssinian is 'extreme' other than its devotion to its owners! Abyssinian Breeders are dedicated to producing as healthy and natural looking cats as possible.

Korat. It's an easy task to define the Korat, as it is the blue cat of Thailand. Indeed, its very name in its native country means exactly that: 'si-sawat' greyish-blue cat. All Korats in the west today can have their ancestry traced back to imports from Thailand. The earliest existing records of the cats of Thailand can be seen in the Bangkok National Library, and are known as the cat-book poems. The Korat entry relates that, 'The base of each hair, Is the colour of a cloud' and Korat eyes are 'Like dew when dropped on the leaf of a lotus'. Korat wish to be involved in the lives of their people and are truly companions. Their natural intelligence, liveliness and playfulness is their charm and someone new to the breed must know of this, and be ready to give time and love, which will then be repaid a

hundredfold.



Russian. The aristocratic Russian Blue is a gem of the feline world. Their short, dense, silver-tipped blue fur glistens and shimmers in the light as they move, providing an elegant setting for their glowing emerald green eyes. They are a medium-sized cat, combining elegance with intelligence. Perhaps lesser known are the Russian Black and Russian White. As their names suggest, they are black or white rather than silvery blue in colour. The Russian Black's coat colour is a dense glossy black to the skin, with black nose leather and paw pads. The coat of the Russian White masks the genetic colour which here in the UK is blue or black and can be checked by a DNA test. The coat must be pure sparkling white with no hint of discolouration, although a kitten or young adult may temporarily carry a small dark patch or patches of blue or black on the head.



Singapura. The Singapura is a medium sized cat of foreign type, with noticeably large eyes and ears, which comes in one colour only - but what an ethereal colour! Large celadon eyes twinkling with mischief in an angelic face help the Singapura reach out and capture the imagination while stealing the heart. These delightful, cats, dressed in the colours of old sepia photographs, are into everything, looking up at you with big innocent eyes when you find them engaged in some mischief. The Singapura is an energy-packed companion that wants to help you with everything you do. The breed originates from Singapore, where its ticked coat pattern and dark brown colour are a common local combination recognised as the original gene pool for ticked tabbies. The first Singapura was imported into Britain in 1989 and they are rapidly increasing in popularity as show cats and pets.

Snowshoe. The Snowshoe is a medium sized cat, well-balanced overall. It is firm and muscular, deceptively powerful and should have an athletic build, with the appearance of a runner rather than a weightlifter. The combination of blue eyes, pointed pattern and white trim are unique in the Foreign Shorthair Section. The origin of the Snowshoe can be traced back to the early 1960s when Dorothy Hinds Daugherty of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania found three kittens in a litter of Siamese, each with four white feet. Dorothy liked the combination of pointed colours and white feet and began the process to establish a breed. In developing the breed, she bred the kittens to a domestic cat with "tuxedo" markings and eventually developed the popular white 'V' facial markings.





Thai. The Thai cats are the Thai Lilac and the Thai Blue Point-very similar to their self-coloured cousin, the Korat. Thais are simply Korats wearing a different coat. Britain is currently the only country which acknowledges these variants. From the earliest days of recorded Korat breeding in the west (1959), kittens have been born occasionally with a Siamese type pattern, i.e. pale body with some shading but the blue colour restricted to the points (face, ears, legs, paws and tail). When in 1989 two Korats mated together in the UK gave birth to a 'pink' kitten, it was a bit of a surprise, to say the least. In the late 1980s and early 1990s other UK-based Korats gave birth to the odd 'white' and 'pink' kitten. It became clear that these new 'colours' were derived from recessive genes which had lain dormant in the Korats for many generations.

Group 2: CORNISH REX, DEVON REX, LAPERM, SPHYNX



Cornish Rex. Cornish Rex make excellent pets. Aristocratic in appearance, they are extremely intelligent, affectionate and gentle whilst still getting up to mischief and never seeming to grow old. Even cats in their mid-teens will still be playful. Some charming characteristics of the breed are their dog-like habits of following their owners around and retrieving their favourite toys. A distinctive feature of the breed is their long toes, which enable them to use their paws like little hands. The breed is elegant, agile, very active and requires companionship.

Devon Rex. Often described as resembling the Gremlins from the Star Wars films, the Devon Rex is a small-to-medium-sized cat with a pixie-like appearance. The defining features of these endearing little cats

are their big eyes, high cheekbones and velvety soft coat that ripples and waves under your touch. These little minxes are friendly, intelligent, curious companions and will make a playful addition to your household.

LaPerm. These charming, friendly cats have an elegant athletic build, and are hardy, healthy and suitable for a range of owners and households. Their most striking feature is their soft coat of shaggy waves, curls and ringlets, which is easy to care for, comes in a wide



range of colours and feels delightful to touch. name LaPerm was chosen to reflect the cats perm-like coats and echoes the local Native American trade language, Chinook Wawa, which absorbed French words. including their definite articles, into its lexicon. The first LaPerms in the UK arrived in 2002 and full championship recognition was granted by the GCCF in 2012.

Sphynx. The intriguing Sphynx cat never fails to draw a reaction from people and is certainly something of a conversation piece - some people love the bald, wrinkled look, some are fascinated by the cat, while others are less than enthusiastic! The most distinctive feature of the cat is its lack of fur. The Sphynx is of medium size, boning and body conformation, its head a modified wedge, with prominent cheekbones and whisker pads. The body is warm and soft to the touch, with a chamois leather-like texture to the skin. The Sphynx is sweet-tempered, lively, intelligent and amenable to handling.





Group 3: AZTEC, BENGAL, EGYPTIAN MAU, OCICAT, SOKOKE, TOYGER

Aztec. The Aztec is an impressive muscular and athletic classic patterned cat with the look of the wild, however there are no wild genes used in Aztec bloodlines. The Aztec is the classic patterned sister breed developed from the Ocicat breed, so they share the same history. Their gait mimics the bigger wild cats, with a low slung stance and high rising shoulder blades when walking, which gives a fluid grace to their movement. The exotic look of the classic tabby patterned Aztec belies its affectionate personality and wonderful temperament. These beautiful cats make loving, engaging and playful companions. They are highly intelligent, social and people-focused cats. Many owners remark on their dog like tendencies, as they enjoy interacting with their human family, respond very well to the voice and can easily be trained. Many will readily play fetch and

reward. Although seen as an exotic breed, the Aztec requires no special care, with their broad genetic background giving them a robust vigour and vitality. The Aztec has an average life span, like most cats, of 15 to 18 years.

Bengal. The Bengal is a medium to large cat of foreign type with a strong, muscular, athletic body. Bengals are now one of the most popular short-haired breeds although they only appeared in the UK around 20 years ago. The Bengal is renowned for the clarity, contrast and pelt-like texture of its beautiful spotted or marbled coat as well as its confident, playful and outgoing personality. The original Bengal preeders in the USA were aiming to create the look of a small spotted wild cat with the friendly and affectionate nature of a domestic pet.

gyptian Mau. The Egyptian Mau is an elegant spotted cat that bears a triking resemblance to the cats depicted in the art of the ancient Egyptians.

ne Mau is a natural breed derived from the modern street cats of Egypt. Part of its attraction is the



romantic history of the breed and the possibility that Maus trace their ancestry directly back to the cats first domesticated by the ancient Egyptians. In ancient Egypt around 4000 years BC, small cats of the genus Felis first began their close, and long-lasting association with man. The Egyptian Mau breed was developed as we know it today after WW2. However, the breed did not reach the UK, perhaps because of the restrictions imposed by quarantine. The first Egyptian Maus were imported to the UK by Professor Melissa Bateson in 1998. The breed was recognized fully by GCCF in 2006.



Ocicat. An impressive muscular cat with the look of the wild, the Ocicat is a man-made domestic cat that adds an exotic flavour to your home. The exotic look of the Ocicat belies its affectionate personality and temperament - and there are no wild genes whatsoever used in Ocicat bloodlines. The Ocicat has a well-muscled, long body with a proportionately long tail. A variety of colours to choose from - tawny, chocolate, cinnamon, blue, lilac and fawn and then also the same colours with the addition of silver. The rich shades resemble the tones of jungle cats and the shimmering silvers add a touch of glamour.

Ocicats are devoted to people, easily trained and respond well to the voice, while retaining their feline independence. They are adaptable cats who easily learn the household rules. However, their social nature

means they are unhappy if left alone for long periods.

Sokoke. The rarest breed of domestic cat in the world, the Sokoke is a lean, medium sized, ticked modified classic tabby cat. It is found as a naturally occurring native breed in the greater Arabuko-Sokoke Forest Preserve area in the coastal zone of Kenya, Africa. The cats are almost extinct now in the wild. A peace-loving, keenly aware and intelligent shorthaired breed, the Sokoke is playful and family oriented, forming close bonds with both feline and human family members. The Sokoke is unique in that it has a see-through ticked tabby pattern, with ticking in both the ground colour and pattern itself, even including the tail tip. This camouflage pattern can also include outlining over the shoulders and

below the spine.
They have a tiptoe gait that becomes more pronounced when they are excited.



Toyger. The Toyger is a medium to large cat of foreign type with a long low slung muscular body and athletic appearance. It is characterised by its striking plush striped glittered coat and superbly amiable temperament. The Toyger is a new breed in the UK. Toygers resemble a small version of the Tiger i.e. a large, long body to display and the bold vertical patterns; which when stretched shows the original mackerel tabby pattern of the cats, with dense and luxuriously soft fur. Toygers are exceptionally sociable, confident and outgoing and love human company, they get on well with children, other cats and cat friendly dogs and make ideal family pets. They are highly intelligent and like company so may not be happy as single cats if left alone for long periods.

Judge Profile

Gianfranco Mantovani (FIFé Italy)

I'm Italian, I live in Italy and I'm member of FIFé. We have always had cats at home, obviously housecats. I got my first Siamese (today we would call him a Thai) in the 70s, even though my first "pedigree" cat was a Persian; at that time in Italy Persians were the most popular purebred cats.

It was at a cat show in 1984 that I saw an unusual cat in the cage next to mine, an Oriental. I hadn't seen this breed before and I fell completely in love. The following year I bought a Chocolate Tabby Spotted Oriental which introduced me to this beautiful breed. Naturally I got more cats, both Siamese and Oriental, and bred a few litters but not enough to call myself a real breeder.

In the meantime I became interested in cat shows and in 1992 I became a FIFé judge for Siamese and Orientals and one year later for the Short Hair Group as well. I have been an all-breed judge since 2004.

About ten years ago I got a Cattery Name (Lapo's)together with my friend Roberto Ferri and I started to breed again with him.


With more knowledge of blood lines and refinement of taste we looked for an English cat. We got our stud, Mafdet Picasso, from Carol Bowles; he's pure Siamese, son of Bernbecks Masterpiece and Amyday Astral Affaire, with a lovely mix of the best English bloodlines: Johpas, Shermese, Mylynn, Sarnau, Pannaduloa, Kamik, just to mention some of the most famous, and many others that have created the history of the Siamese cat. Roberto and I also fell in love with the most extreme Dolicocephalic dogs of the sighthound group, the Borzoi.



My hobby is drawing and my favourite subjects (or models?) are obviously cats and dogs. Drawing helped me a lot with my judging training.

It's truly a honour for me to judge at this Supreme Show, one of the most prestigious shows in the world and I thank the GCCF Board for giving me this wonderful opportunity.

Judge Profile

Stephe Bruin (FIFé Netherlands)

My first Siamese came to live with me in 1968. I fell in love with the breed and soon acquired a Lilac Point. From England, I imported a Seal Tortie Point, (later Int. Ch.) Kernow Thani, bred by Mrs. P. Evely. Int Ch Kernow Thani's grand sire was Ch Bradgate Yippee. It was assumed that a gene for 'true milk chocolate' was passed on through him. True or not, I bred some correctly coloured Chocolate Points instead of the many 'neither-nors', Chocolates that were taken for Seals, that were produced previously in The Netherlands.

Later, as the registrar for Siamese and Orientals, I used to issue about 1300 pedigrees a year (all typed by hand by a small group of devotees).

To keep up with anything that was happening in the cat fancy in Great Britain we close-read Fur & Feather and any book on any breed written in the English language by notable breeders and authors. We were so taken by it all that I knew many pedigrees of famous cats by heart (and was proud to recite from them...).



I am a member of Felikat, The Netherlands, affiliated to FIFe. Under their system I was trained to become an all-breed judge through the following phases: Siamese, Balinese and Shorthaired & Longhaired Orientals (1981), Persians & Exotics (1983), Shorthairs (1988) and Semi-Longhairs (1994).

I have been judging regularly around Europe and a few times in South Africa, Australia, New Zealand, South America, Asia and the USA. Interesting cats were judged, various show systems were appraised and appreciated, which contributed to my overall perception of cats and pedigree cats, the cat fancy and the role and impact of the cat judge.

In my function of president of FIFe's Judges and Standards Commission in the previous century I've seen the recognition of many breeds and varieties we take for granted and couldn't do without now.

When I was first invited to judge at a show in Great Britain when I was a young judge, a dream came true. The magic still works.

And look where I am now. If you ask me if there is a breed or variety that I particularly fancy? Perhaps I am as most judges are, always on the lookout for that particular individual that comes close to being perfect in type and has a temperament to match its beauty. In such cases, breed or variety don't really matter.

After having lived through the decades with a bunch of Siamese, some Persians, Cornish Rex, Westies and Belgian Sheepdogs (Lakenois), my husband and I are currently being held hostage by Abracazebra de Broeckloni, a neutered British Silver Blotched Tabby & White of four years old.

Russian Blue - GEMS RUS a

This breed has a long, graceful body and legs with a fairly long tail and a medium length head with a short straight nose making a distinct angle with the forehead. The "Russian" look is created by the large ears set on top of the head, the prominent whisker pads either side of the nose and the almond-shaped, vivid green eyes. A distinctive feature of this breed is its short, fine, velvety dense, clear blue coat which stands up from the body and shows a beautiful silvery sheen.

Korat - GEMS KOR

Another breed of medium foreign type with a blue coat, which is glossy and close-lying but short to medium in length, with silver tipping. The type differences between this and other breeds are that the back is gently curved and the head is heart-shaped when viewed from the front; the ears are large and set high and the nose has a slight downward curve. The eyes, which are particularly large and luminous, are a brilliant green, although an amber cast is acceptable in younger cats.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE

Cats sleep for around 12 to 16 hours a day and are generally considered to be either naturally nocturnal (most active at night) or else crepuscular (most active at dawn or dusk) and sleep for over 70% of their life. Cats have powerful night vision, allowing them to see at light levels six times lower than a human needs in order to see.

Cats have over 20 muscles that control their ears.

Cats have an extra organ, that allows them to control breathing so they can 'taste' the air; you may see your cat grimacing when doing this!

Proof that cats are good for us; owning a cat can reduce the risk of stroke and heart attack by a third.

Cats and humans have nearly identical sections of the brain that control emotion.



Breed Profiles

Group 1: BURMESE



Playful, energetic. Burmese. acrobatic and highly intelligent, the Burmese cat is the extrovert of the cat world. Despite their sweet expression, they are mischievous but they love - or should that be adore - people and human company. The most charming of cats, with their big gold eves and shiny close-lying coats, Burmese will win your heart. Once you have known a Burmese, you will have a lifelong passion for the breed. Cuddly, confident and sociable sums up the Burmese cat perfectly. If you are looking for an outgoing, lively cat who wants to be part of your family then the Burmese is for you. Burmese cats love the company of people; they are very good with children, other cats and dogs and are said to stay close to home. If you enjoy the fun-loving life. and quiet mischievous Burmese probably aren't for you.

Group 2 AUSTRALIAN MIST, ASIAN, TONKINESE

Asian. The Asian Group of cats consists of five varieties: Self, which includes the 17 recognised self and tortie colours; smoke; shaded, called Burmilla; Tabby, which includes ticked, mackerel, spotted and classic tabby patterns; and the semilonghaired version which is called the Tiffanie. The Asian breed originated in the UK in 1981 from a mismating between a lilac Burmese queen and a Chinchilla Persian boy. Early breeders decided that they should look like Burmese, but with a range of new colours, patterns and with two hair-lengths: shorthair and semi-longhair. The breed was named "Asian" and by 2003 all five varieties had reached GCCF championship status.



Australian Mist. Arriving from Australia in 2007, the Australian Mist is one of our newer breeds. Originally known as the spotted Mist, this breed originated in Australia in 1977, using a combination of Burmese (50%) and Abyssinian (25%), outcrossed to domestic shorthaired cats (25%). Australian Mists are medium-sized short-haired cats, with round heads and large eyes. The coat is very short, without an undercoat. The Mist is an agouti cat, which can be spotted or marbled (classic) pattern and can be found in 6 colours brown, blue, chocolate, lilac, cinnamon and fawn. The temperament of the Australian Mist is delightful. They are great with children and are wonderful companions to both young and old. They are perfect lap cats and enjoy the company of other animals.





Tonkinese. The Tonkinese is the result of crossing a Siamese with a Burmese and it displays characteristics from both breeds. They are very people-orientated and make ideal family pets. Tonks, as they are affectionately known, are very inquisitive and intelligent. Originally they were developed in America in the 1950s and were called 'Golden Siamese' but the breed did not take off and became ignored. It was not until the 1960s when they reappeared called Tonkinese that the popularity grew and they became popular pets and show cats. Gregarious in nature, the Tonkinese is a purring solid package of pure love who knows that your whole purpose for being is to give all your love and attention to him or her. They are a medium-sized muscular cat with a sense of humour and will entertain you for hours with their antics. Tonkinese, like their Burmese and Siamese cousins, are long lived and ages of nineteen and twenty are quite common. Tonkinese have no specific health problems and are capable of a long and active life.



Breed Profiles

Group 1: ORIENTAL, SUFFOLK



The Oriental. Orientals are long, slender, stylised cats. They are lively, talkative and intelligent and are very attached to their people. What makes the Oriental Shorthair distinct from the rest of the Siamese group is their wide array of colours. Oriental Shorthairs are a very lively, elegant and colourful cat, in every sense. These are not cats for people who want to live a quiet life but they are wonderful for those who want an interactive and amusing pet and a truly devoted companion. The Oriental Longhair (formerly known as the Angora, and also known as the Javanese in some countries) is the longhaired version of the Oriental Shorthair just as the Balinese is the longhaired version of the Siamese. The overall impression of these cats is that they are elegant, slender and graceful; they are long and lean and are natural athletes with a surprising weight of muscle on their narrow frame.

Suffolk. The Suffolk is one of the newest breeds of cat accepted for registration in June 2014 by the GCCF, and given Preliminary recognition in 2016. It has been developed over the past ten years by two dedicated traditional Havana breeders who both live in Suffolk. It is available in chocolate, and its recessive colour lilac. It is a charming, beautiful cat, with a sleek shiny coat and vivid green eyes. Suffolks were made for our modern lifestyle and are equally at home in a London penthouse or a tiny cottage in the country. The Suffolk Chocolate has a dog like character, and is devoted to its owner and family. It is extremely talkative, brave, and very happy to accompany its owner on their travels, even wearing a harness. They make an ideal house cat, as they prefer the company of their owner, rather than being left to wander.

Group 2: BALINESE, SIAMESE

The Balinese. The graceful Balinese can be described as a Siamese cat in a long coat. The fine-boned, Balinese is a stylish cat with a slender body. Its coat is fine and silky lying close to the body, and the lack of an undercoat reduces the likelihood of matting. The Balinese is a vocal cat that enjoys 'chatting' with you. If you are looking for an interactive, vocal cat then the graceful Balinese may be for you. Their pointed pattern means colour is restricted to the face (mask), ears, legs and tail, with a contrasting creamy white body. They have brilliant blue eyes. Extremely loving, inquisitive and playful, they demand lots of attention and game-playing. Balinese get on well with children and other pets and fit easily into the family. Remember though they are chatty and have high energy levels! Considered to be one of the most intelligent cat breeds. The Balinese is medium-sized, with males weighing 6 to 8 lbs and females ranging from 5 to 7 lbs. Life span is 18 to 22 years.

Siamese. The Siamese is a medium sized cat with a long, lithe body that is graceful and elegant but still has a muscular feel. Its legs are slender and paws small and oval; the tail is long and tapering. The most recognised features of the Siamese cat are the coloured points seen on the mask, limbs and tail, and their mesmerising blue eyes. Together with large ears, the coloured points and blue eyes create the unique look of the breed. The Siamese originated in what is now Thailand and has been in existence for hundreds of years. Legend says that Siamese cats were sacred cats and guarded Buddhist temples. They were imported into Britain in the 1800s. The original Siamese colour was the classic seal brown points with a warm cream coloured body, but breeders developed more colours by introducing other breeds of cat into the breeding schedule. The original Siamese had eye squints and tail kinks which are now considered serious faults but at one time these 'faults' were so common there are fables written in folklore to tell of their origin.




Judge Profile Pina Bruo-Grieve (GCCF)

GCCF Registration Explained

Perhaps after visiting the GCCF Supreme Cat Show today you are thinking of having a kitten/cat? A walk through the Meet the Cats section of the show, where you can get up close to the various breeds the GCCF recognises and talk to their owners and breeders may have given you an idea of the type of cat you'd like. But how to make sure you get a pure bred Registered pedigree? The information below should help. Checking the registration details will enable you to get the right cat for your requirements. Always let your breeder know when you make the first contact if you want to buy a kitten for breeding and/or showing.

GCCF Registers affect showing and breeding

Breed Advisory Committees (BACs), made up of the Clubs responsible for that breed, have Registration Policies which dictate which register the kitten is registered on for the benefit of the breed and its development.

There are thumbnail sketches within this Year Book of the various breeds the GCCF currently recognises, however if you go to www.gccfcats.org and click on the "Cat Breeds" tab, you will be able to find the registration policy for your chosen breed, simply click on any cat's picture for more breed information, then look on the left hand side for other links and information.

If you decide to visit a breeder and you fall in love with the kittens, ask to see the registration policy of mum (dam) and dad (sire) if they have the father too. These are some of the things to look out for on their official pedigree papers:

- FULL REGISTER (before 15 July 2016 registration number begins CS)
 A cat/kitten resulting from a mating ideal to produce that breed; it can be shown, and if agreed by the breeder, it can be used for breeding.
- SUPPLEMENTARY REGISTER (before 15 July 2016 registration number begins CSSR)
 A cat/kitten that will have a slightly different background, as the breeding may be more experimental in terms of colour/pattern, or the kitten may be part of a breed development programme that is nearing completion. All kittens on this register can be shown, and if agreed by the breeder, they can be used for breeding.
- REFERENCE REGISTER (before 15 July 2016 registration number begins CSREF)
 There will be something more unusual about the cats in the pedigree of a reference registered cat. It may be that an outcross has been recently made to a cat of different breed, or there is an import from a country where recognised registration of cats is not common (these cats are often termed foundation cats for the breed). A reference registered cat/kitten is NOT ALLOWED to be shown in pedigree competition classes, and future breeding will be part of the planned programme of an experienced breeder with a knowledge of breed development and register progression.

You can read more about breed development and progression in the breeding policy of your chosen breed (listed with the registration policy if there is one) and see the GCCF's Outcrossing Policy to learn of its importance. www.gccfcats.org/Breeding-Information/GCCF-Outcrossing-Policy

EXPERIMENTAL REGISTER - discontinued 21 October 2015
 A cat/kitten of a relatively new breed used to be EXP registered. This is not used anymore, but you may see it with an ancestor in your cat or kitten's pedigree.

GCCF Breeding Status via Registration

maddition to the registers above which can affect breeding and showing, the suitability for breeding will be controlled by the Breeder by a decision on each kitten's breeding status. You are advised to read GCCF Rules 1 & 2.

- ACTIVE REGISTER the breeder has registered the cat as suitable for breeding from. Kittens produced may be registered with no restrictions provided the mate chosen is suitable, according to the Registration Policy for the breed.
- NON-ACTIVE REGISTER the breeder is selling you a kitten who is going to be a pet for companionship and possibly showing.

In some circumstances (for example white cats of all breeds) non-active registration is compulsory until a specific physical or genetic test has been made that proves the cat free from a medical or genetic condition.

If you are buying a cat that you expect to be transferred from the non-active to the active register, please make sure you and the breeder have discussed any conditions and you have a copy of these in writing and signed by the breeder.

• GENETIC REGISTER - a registration policy may direct cats that have not been tested clear for a specific disease/condition shall have registration documents with 'Genetic Register' stated. Such cats may be used for breeding, but this should be by an experienced breeder as part of a breed development programme.

- Choose your breed
- 2. Read through its registration and breeding policy
- 3. Take a look at the GCCF Rules (1-10) about what breeders should be doing when they register kittens, advertise them for sale and transfer to new ownership.
- 4. Check out the GCCF Breeder Scheme
- Talk to breeders about your requirements.
- Then go and play with some kittens!

The first step on this pathway for full recognition and the ability to show cats at Championship Status is the recognition of a Breed Name.

Last year, Lykoi started down the path towards future breed recognition within the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy. In the US, where they were first bred and recognised, they have been extensively tested for health issues, dominant traits. Their paperwork was sent in to the GCCF offices last September and subsequently a breed number and name recognition was granted. The breed is currently at least three or four years away from full GCCF recognition, though last year they were promoted to full Championship status for TICA.



Lykoi have been bred from a natural mutation, found in the USA, Italy, France and other countries. Natural Lykoi have been popping up for years, but they were usually euthanized or sterilised. This was because it was thought that there was something wrong with them due to their lack of undercoat. They have since been tested, are perfectly healthy and we are working towards a very healthy gene pool.

The name Lykoi was chosen for them, because Lykoi or Lycaon, means werewolf in Greek, which is what is was thought the Lykoi looked like. This is due to the mask like appearance on their faces and the fact that they mutate like a werewolf.



Lykoi are born as fully coated fluffy kittens and start to mutate at around five days of age. They can become almost completely hairless but are not related to the hairless Sphynx. They will moult on and off throughout their lives.

Lykoi have what is known as a Roan coat, which is known to no other cat breed. Roan means that for every black hair, there is a white hair. The first Lykoi born in the UK is Shalnavazz Teddy Lupin who was born on the 14th May 2015. This year Teddy has sired several beautiful Lykoi babies.

Lykoi are bred for health, nature and type. Lykoi are wonderful and very affectionate, playful cats with highly intelligent and very inquisitive natures.


Harlequin & Van Patterns Gain Promotion

On 17th October 2018 received recognition for the Harlequin and Van patterns for British short haired cats.

The following article discusses the patterns in greater detail, superbly modelled by two stunning cats Loraston Lord Nelson and Alfiebritz Campurr-Van.

Harlequin. BSH yxz 02. This is the SOP for the Loraston BSH a 02 neuter (blue and white) coat Colour & Pattern. The Harlequin is essentially a higher white cat than the standard Bi-Colour but is not as predominantly white as the Van Pattern. The Harlequin has random patches of colour of any shape, predominantly larger than a thumbprint, on white and allows for colour to be anywhere on the face. Patches can be made up of one self-colour on white and in the case of torties, patches of base colour with red or cream as appropriate on white. White areas must represent well over half of the overall coat, at

least 60%. Go to: www.gccfcats.org/Portals/0/BritishSHSOP.Template.pdf?ver=2018-06-28-102348-283 for the full Standard.

There should be several patches of colour, preferably with colour on the head and there must be colour on the face. The patches can be small or large but they must be clearly defined, with the lines of division, between colour and white as free as possible of scattered white hairs between the colour and white. Patches of colour may be surrounded by white, as in separate coloured patches or may be joined together with other coloured patches, in the case of torties. The tail must be fully coloured, from the base to the tip. No white hairs within the coloured areas of patching, which should also be free of tabby markings (please refer to specific notes for red and cream series), however, kittens should not be unduly penalized for heavy tabby markings.

Coat Colour - Patches of one self-colour and white. The patches of colour should be clear and well defined, without tabby markings (please refer to specific notes for red and cream series). A predominantly white cat with small patches of colour on the head but not below the level of the eye or beyond the base of the rear of the ears. The colour on the head should preferably be separated by a vertical white blaze. The tail should be fully coloured. For perfection there should be no colour on the body or legs. However, no more than three small colour patches ("thumb-prints") may be allowed in an otherwise excellent example of the breed. These patched areas do not need to conform to a uniform shape.

Alfiebritz Campurr–Van. BSH c 01. Lilac & white Van Patterned kitten. Campurr-Van has also won 4 merits as a kitten & Overal BSH at a show then 2 as an adult.

Catching Dreams

Supreme Cat Show 28th October 2017 – a show and a date that will be forever engraved in my heart, and the day dreams came true in spectacular fashion.

Backtrack 23 years to 1994, our first Supreme in our first year of showing nonpedigrees. Much bigger in those days, with the added attraction of the Whiskers

Stakes competition, and, for someone at their first ever Supreme a huge occasion and atmosphere, and a show that gave birth to "the dream", to win the ultimate accolade, Supreme Non-Pedigree (there were only non-pedigrees in those days). We tried, oh how we tried, Tanya, our first "show mog", Bonnie, Dancer, several

others over the years and then, Raffles "Littleman Raffles", the one we had high hopes of. Raffles attended his first Supreme in 1998 and 10 years later, in 2008, after so nearly getting there in 2004 with Best Longhair, achieved Best Non-Pedigree; after 14 years of trying, we had finally done it.

All this was in the days before household pet (HP) titles and pedigree pets. With their introduction in 2009. numbers of non-pedigrees dwindled but the competition became fiercer. By now we were also showing our little tortie & white non-ped, Rainbowdreamcatcher,

who gradually began to climb her way to the top, becoming the very first HP to win an Olympian title, overtaking Raffles' haul of 30 Best In Show/Best of Variety wins (66 at the time of writing), but always out of reach, it appeared, was the Supreme title. By 2012 she had won every title available to an HP in the GCCF except that Supreme one. She was a UK, Olympian Gold, Imperial Grand Master Cat but seemed unable to go that final step. She so very nearly did it in 2014 when she won Best Shorthair Non-Pedigree but was beaten by the Longhair for Overall and, at the age of 12 1/2 we genuinely thought it would remain the one title that she was never to win. But we kept trying, as long as she still enjoyed showing we would never give up on our dream for Dream.

So, Supreme 2017, we had 3 HPs entered – Dream, Angel, who was our new kitten, and our pedigree pet, Joshy, (OG IGMC Sr Joshus Purrkins). We had hopes for Angel but she spooked at a noise and, quite rightly, lost the BOC to the boy. I wasn't really holding out much hope for Dream but that day she was on the best form I had ever seen her at the Supreme. She charmed the judges, purred her head off the whole time and literally smashed the competition for BOC out of the water. It wasn't that the cats she beat were bad, they most certainly were not, but she just had her sights set that day and when she won Best Shorthair Non-Pedigree out of 3 by a unanimous decision from all 3 judges, and beat the previous year's Supreme Non-Pedigree, I began to hope.

Meanwhile, over in Pedigree Pets Joshy lost out on the UK Grand by a whisker but then won BOC to earn his place in front of the 3 judges for Best Longhair Pedigree Pet, also out of 3. This time it was a split decision, each judge went for a different cat and it was down to a referee judge. I could hardly believe it when Joshy was chosen! To have Dream going up on stage to compete for Overall Best Non-Pedigree was one thing, but to have Joshy up there as well for Pedigree Pet was unbelievable.

So, on to the main stage for the Best in Show judging. First up were the non-pedigrees, Dream and a stunning longhair who had been Supreme Non-Pedigree Kitten in 2016. I hardly dared breath. Was it to be another so close but so far, and losing out to the longhair again? Our good friends who run the rescue Dream came from were at my side. The cats went across, first the longhair, then Dream. The judges scribbled down numbers on slips, and time stood still. Then Dream's pen number was announced as the winner. She had done it!!! I was



in tears, finally, after years of trying and after almost not even entering her this year, she had done it, and by a unanimous decision again. Our wonderful, sweet, most "un-tortie-like tortie" had gained the title of Supreme Non-Pedigree, the one title I always thought would elude her! And at the age of 12 ½!


Then it was the turn of the pedigree pets, and Joshy. I watched but knowing that the shorthair he was against

was a superb cat, and as we had already won the Non-Pedigree, I really thought we had no chance. To win both would be unheard of, it was not going to happen. Except it did. By a 2 to 1 vote Joshy was Supreme Pedigree Pet. I think at that point I actually dropped to my knees, to win one, but both??? It was surreal, wonderful, but surreal. I was crying again, I was surrounded by fantastic supportive friends, I was hugged, I was in a total daze, and then the final unbelievable announcement was made. For the first time ever the Supreme was to award an Overall Supreme Household Pet from the Non Pedigree, the Pedigree Pet and the Kitten, and Dream had won it, with Joshy being the Reserve. I honestly cannot fully describe my feelings at this point, joy, disbelief, extreme emotions, I do know that I spent a good part of the next hour wandering the hall in a daze, taking nothing in, and repeating to myself "this is not real, this is not happening, it's all a

dream and I am going to wake up soon". But although it WAS a dream, it was a real one, one come true, a double one in fact and our Dreamcatcher had truly lived up to her name that day and in fact, although this has not been confirmed and I may be wrong, I think that it was possibly the first time one owner had won both the Overall Supreme and the Reserve in the same section on the same day. Whether or not that IS true, nothing can, or will, ever take away the pure magic of that momentous achievement, and, moreover, one done with 2 older cats, aged 12 1/2 and 11 1/2.

Breed Profiles

NON-PEDIGREE & PEDIGREE PETS



Half - Pedigrees (Pedigree Look-a-like).

These are half-pedigrees, which can either be the mating of an accidental whoops litter, (where the female has managed to wiggle through a window etc. and managed to mate with the local Tom cat) or the crossing of two full pedigrees which is not allowed under either of the parents breed standard (something like a Persian mating with a Korat, or any other x breed mated with an x). These cats would not be recognised as being of any breed, and will not have a pedigree either even if they favour one of their parents characteristics. Because of pedigree blood, their colours and patterns can be somewhat more varied then a true domestic shorthair. They are shown as Pedigrees in the Household Pet Section, which contains an extra class not included in the Non-Ped section, that of AOC (Any Other Colour) for tipped, ticked, shaded, smoke and pointed patterns associated with some of the cats with Pedigree heritage.

Non-pedigree. Non-Pedigree cats can also be called domestic cats. These cats have absolutely no known or recognisable pedigree parentage. They come in all different shapes, sizes and coat lengths and patterns, from solid colours like a black and white, also known as self, meaning single or solid colour - through to some different varieties of (mackerel), spotted. striped tabby, blotched/classic which is like a butterfly with whirls and lines in the coat pattern. They can be tortoiseshell, which can be seen in bold patches of colour all over the cat, or sometimes subtly mingled, where the colours seem to fade into each other, or even a tortoiseshell tabby. White can be see mixed with all of the above. These are the ONLY cats allowed to be shown in the Non-Pedigree section of the Household Pet group. Cats which are smoked (a band of colour on the 2nd half of each hair, usually black but may be any other colour are considered to have some pedigree parentage.





Pedigree Pets

Pedigree Pet. These are Pedigree cats which should not or cannot be shown in the pedigree section of a show. They may or may not have papers (their pedigree certificate and certificate of registration) as they are rescue cats, or they may show one or two 'faults' that make it impossible to show under their breed's Standard of Points; this can be anything from the wrong eye colour, colour in the wrong place, a broken or unbroken 'necklace' in the pattern round its neck, to a tail fault (a kink or blip in the tail).

All the cats in the **Household Pet Group** may also be shown if they have
fully healed physical injuries such as a
nick from an ear, or the loss of a tail or
limb as it is the cat's character, health

and wellbeing that is being judged as a Standard, rather than their physical attributes.

The essential qualities of these exhibits are that they are happy, much loved examples of the non-pedigree cat who are being shown in sparkling tip-top condition; naturally one looks more beautiful to one person than to the next, but they are all beautiful in the eyes of their owners.



GCCF Young Exhibitors' Scheme



We currently have over 84 Candidates on the scheme from all across the UK – England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales.



What is YES!?

Welcome, and thank you for your interest in the Young Exhibitor Scheme (YES!). So, who are we, and what do we do?

The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy is the oldest cat registration body in the UK, dating back to 1910, with the first cat show in the UK taking place even earlier on Thursday 13th July 1871, so it would be fair to say we know a thing or two about our four legged, purry friend – which is not to say we're never willing to learn more!

There are more than 150 member clubs of the GCCF currently catering for 39 recognised breeds, with several other new breeds seeking to gain preliminary recognition at the moment. For the GCCF to officially recognise a 'New Breed' you can be sure that it will not

only have taken the cat's unique appearance and colour/s into consideration, but also how the health of the cat will be impacted by its appearance too.

So what is YES! Put simply, YES! is an educational programme designed to encourage youth participation in the Cat Fancy. It is a structured programme for the growth and development of junior (8 - 16+) exhibitors within the GCCF. We hope to encourage young people to continue to enjoy and understand their hobby as adults and so become the exhibitors, breeders, stewards, judges and show managers of the future.

What is the scope of YES!?

The scheme focuses upon responsible cat care and ownership alongside the exhibition of cats and the management structure surrounding a GCCF Licenced Show. We aim to build a strong foundation for future development, not only in personal advancement, growth and responsibility, but also a deepening respect and recognition for all animals, felines in particular. Young exhibitors who join the scheme will be encouraged to progress from Novice to the Advanced level through a series of structured activities, learning strategies and personal involvement.

The programme is designed to increase the candidate's knowledge of all domestic cats, whether of unknown or pedigree origin. For the pedigree breeds, all aspects of body and head type, colours and patterns and their different coat qualities will be covered as well as basic genetics and an introduction to the work carried out by the Breed Advisory Committees (BAC's) responsible for each breed. For the domestic shorthair

we will explain the differences between a household and pedigree pet in show terms and the conditions that need to be met for them to be shown.

Candidates will be able to develop their skills with regard to show and preparation grooming as well as the clerical aspects of entering cats into shows and recording results, running special section or event alongside show, as well



learning the skills necessary to become a hall or show manager.

What can Candidates achieve?

We undertake a system of evidence based learning, with a strong focus on the candidates abilities and strengths. Progress and success is measured and rewarded at every stage with a special focus on the candidate's practical knowledge of cats, cat care and cat shows.

Candidates progress from Novice to the Advanced level of the scheme by:-

- Completing work sheets.
- Keeping a Show Diary.
- Practical demonstrations
 - Presenting their cat to a judge.
 - Second Stewarding.
 - Undertaking table work (clerking) at a Show.

Candidates may also achieve Special Certificates which are Exceptional Achievement Awards for:-

- Outstanding work in the "My Cat" project activity.
- Outstanding Presentations.
- Outstanding Second Stewarding.
- Outstanding table work at a show.
- Or extra activities such as running a cuddly toy competition or treasure hunt within a show (with the Show Managers full support and with prior agreement).
- Or extra activities when working with other organisations at (Schools, Guides, Brownies etc.) with photo evidence for their folder.

Progress is monitored, moderated and maintained by the Administrators of the scheme. It is the Administrators of YES! who will judge when the candidates have met and completed the requirements for each level. Each level of Achievement is marked by a signed certificate from the GCCF Chairman.

What is new about the scheme?

Since the June 2017 Council Meeting, all GCCF shows are required to offer Young Exhibitor Classes in their Show Schedule. One of the most exciting aspects of the YES! Programme is the Young Exhibitor Class at participating GCCF Shows; here the candidate presents their own cat to a judge and discusses aspects of at participating, care, diet and show preparation necessary to ensure peak condition, welfare and wellbeing. If a pull or Society has not yet put on a YES! Class for Candidates, you can contact them and ask them to do so.

YES! now has more content for each level. New and exciting opportunities to learn how to read the awards boards and judging books. How a cat in competition may progress through the different stages of a show and win Best In Show. How to plan a cat show, the type of work involved and how to set out and show hell plan.

manage a hall plan.

What about Health & Safety?

All parents want to keep their children safe and as risk free as possible. The advantage of the YES! Programme is that it is a family activity where the Candidate travels to and from shows with their parent(s)/guardian/or a responsible adult chosen by the parents. Once enrolled in the YES!, Candidates will be able to access our members only area, which gives full information about Health & Safety issues.

In common with other Cat Registration Bodies having a programme for young exhibitors, the GCCF has introduced a Parental/Medical Consent Form for parents/guardians to complete and sign before their child may participate



in the scheme. This is for the benefit of the candidate, their parents/guardians and the YES! Programme.

Safeguarding Information

The Young Exhibitors Scheme (YES!) as part of the Governing Council of the Cat Fancy (GCCF) are committed to safe practices when working with young people within the cat fancy.

YES! has a dedicated Safeguarding Officer and robust safeguarding practices designed to keep the Candidates working through all levels of our programme and sister group YES! Kitten Club, safe and secure.

Candidates who attend seminars and cat club events should only do so with their parents and/or guardians. Candidates will only be contacted outside of a show environment by a YES! Administrator. GCCF Breeders Scheme

With health & welfare is at the heart of everything the GCCF does; our principle aim is to encourage responsible breeding of pedigree cats, and responsible owning of all cats, pedigree or otherwise — that is why we set up the GCCF Breeder Scheme in 2013, to help us achieve that objective.

Breeders who have signed up to the GCCF Breeder Scheme have shown their commitment to the standards required by the scheme's **code of ethics**. Please note that not all GCCF breeders will have signed up to using the scheme; this does not mean that they are not excellent or reputable breeders. The code requires breeders to meet various criteria, as listed below:

- They must show commitment to their breed by being a member of a GCCF affiliated cat club for the breed.
- They must be familiar with what the breed should look and behave like and endeavour to breed cats
 of this type.
- They must ensure that their own cats are well cared for.
- They must take steps to make sure the kittens they breed have the best chance of a happy, healthy
 life and leave them fit and well. Kittens must have completed the full course of vaccines, been
 examined by a vet at least twice and be GCCF registered and insured.
- They must try to make sure that kittens which they breed go to suitable loving homes and that their new owners are given the help and support they need to look after them.

Breeder's premises are currently not inspected as part of the scheme so you are advised to make sure you are happy with the environment and way in which the kittens are raised before purchasing. The GCCF cannot take responsibility for the health of any kitten purchased using the Breeder Scheme facility.

When you buy a kitten from a Breeder Scheme breeder you will have the opportunity to tell us what you think of them. We will use this information to make sure our breeders are meeting your and your new cat's needs.

Breeders who sign up for the Scheme have to supply a wealth of information to satisfy the current criteria. The Scheme was created to provide a trustworthy environment for new owners to find a kitten that suits them. Breeders Scheme Members want to be supportive to the new owners of their kitten, providing help and advice on how best to care for their new addition to the family. The aim of the GCCF Breeder Scheme is to create a safe avenue for kittens (and cats) to be bought and sold. New owners want to know that the kitten they are buying is registered, has been properly cared for and they will have a person to go to for advice. The GCCF hope that by providing this service and becoming the "first stop" for kitten selection, backstreet breeders of unregistered and uncared for kittens will be driven out.

Key Points of the Scheme:

- Every kitten bought from a GCCF Breeder Scheme Member will be registered, vaccinated, and carry an initial period of insurance.
- Every GCCF Breeder Scheme Member is supported by their Vet.
- Every GCCF Breeder Scheme Member is a member of at least one GCCF Breed Club relevant to the Breed they are selling so that they have a source of advice and access to the process that governs the Way their Breed is registered.
- New owners can give feedback.

Registration for Breeders

For a breeder to become a part of the GCCF Breeder Scheme. There are 4 initial requirements:

- 1. They must already hold a GCCF registered prefix.
- 2. They must be a fully paid up member of a GCCF Full Member Cat Club relevant to the breed they wish to support; and remain a Full Member throughout the time they are registered on the Scheme. If the registered prefix is held in joint names, then both parties must remain breed club members throughout the time that they are registered on the Scheme.
- 3. They must have a vet that will endorse their application.
- 4. They must agree to abide by the Code of

Ethics of the GCCF and the enhanced Code of Ethics of the Breeders Scheme.

Once these criteria have been met, the breeder may then complete and submit the required paperwork to the GCCF for the Board's approval.

General Code Of Ethics For Breeders And Owners

Registered owners of all GCCF registered cats/kittens accept the jurisdiction of The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy and undertake to abide by this general code of ethics. Owners should think carefully and take advice before getting a kitten and choose a breed suited to their lifestyle.

- They should only keep as many cats as they can care for responsibly.
- 2. Cats and kittens must be provided with warm and comfortable housing, with plenty of opportunity for exercise and play. The cat should be kept indoors at night for their own safety. Drinking water must be available at all times and cats must be fed regularly and adequately. Breeders will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing cats in a new home.
- 3. All cats need some grooming to keep the cat in good condition and to check for parasites, e.g. fleas. Longhair cats need daily grooming to prevent the formation of knots and matted areas of fur which cause them considerable discomfort.
- 4. Veterinary attention must be sought whenever a cat is showing signs of illness.
- 5. Cats that are bought as pets, not for breeding, should be neutered or spayed at an age recommended by your veterinary surgeon. If cats are registered with Non-Active status, this means that under no circumstances should they be bred from; no progeny from these cats will be registered by the GCCF.
- 6. Breeders agree only to sell cats where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life.

 An offer should be made at the time of sale to help with the rehoming if at any time circumstances require the cat to be found a new home.
- 7. Owners should not sell any cat to commercial cat wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly or indirectly allow cats to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind.
- 8. Breeders must not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise cats nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of the cats and must draw attention of purchase to the implications of the Non-Active status when selling pet kittens.

- 9. Breeders selling kittens with Active Status should offer advice and support to the new owners. Owners should not breed cats in a way that is deleterious to the health of the cat or the breed.
- 10. Owners should consider carefully the best means of identifying their cats in case it should become lost. This can be done by means of a microchip which can be painlessly inserted under the cat's skin by your veterinary surgeon and then registering the number of your cat with the PetLog registration scheme run by Kennel Club/RSPCA and also by notifying the GCCF of the cat's chip number. The alternative is for the cat to wear some form of identification on a collar. However, there are dangers for cats wearing collars, as they may become hooked up and caught by them or more likely the collar will break or come off the cat's head, therefore preventing easy identification.
- 11. Breeders/owners must ensure that all relevant Governing Council of the Cat Fancy documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a cat in accordance with Rule 10 (see below), including a copy of this code.

Recommendation

The GCCF strongly recommends that no kitten should be permitted to go to a new home before 13 weeks of age. (Scheme members MUST do this.)

- Mating Certificate:- Section 1 Rule 3d. When a litter is registered, the application to register must be accompanied by a copy of the Mating Certificate which the owner of the stud must provide unless the person registering the kitten(s) is also the registered owner of the sire and at mating to the owner of the queen upon collection of the queen.
- Transfer of Registration Section 1 Rule 10. 10a When a cat or kitten is advertised or sold as a pedigree cat or kitten, the breeder shall at the time of sale provide the purchaser with a properly completed pedigree signed by the breeder, carrying 3 generations at least showing all the breed numbers and registration numbers and also the breeder's name and address.
- •If the vendor is not the breeder, then the pedigree must additionally be signed by the vendor.
- •If the cat/kitten is not registered, a copy of the mating certificate (Rule 3d) shall be supplied by the vendor to the new owner.
- o 10b. i. If, at the time of sale the cat or kitten is registered, the seller shall provide the purchaser with the registration card to enable a transfer of ownership duly completed and signed by the seller, unless it is jointly agreed in writing by both parties at the time of sale not to do so. If this card is lost, damaged or otherwise unavailable a manual transfer form must be completed with the signatures of both parties.
- one week prior to sale and/or leaving for a new home unless it is agreed otherwise in writing and signed by both parties.

GCCF ADVANCED CODE OF ETHICS (In Full)

The following is an voluntary 'best practice' standard for members of the GCCF Breeder Scheme, in addition to the GCCF General Code of Ethics for Owners and Breeders and the Defra Code of Practice for the Welfare of Cats.

The GCCF Breeders' Code of Ethics For GCCF Breeder Scheme. As a GCCF Breeder I am over 18 and pleased to make the following assurances:

1. Regarding my breed

- 1.1. I am a member of at least one GCCF affiliated breed club.
- 1.2. I am familiar with the Standard of Points and Registration Policy and work within the Breeding Policy for my breed.
- 1.3. I shall breed discriminately and only from cats in good health, of good breed type and with no known detrimental genetic health issues. I make use of any recommended health tests relevant to my breed.
- 1.4. I shall make sure that any cats I register on the GCCF active register, whether for myself or a fellow breeder, meet the same criteria.
- 1.5. I shall give careful consideration to the frequency with which a stud cat is used and with which queens they are mated with in order to maintain genetic diversity within the breed.

2. Regarding the day to day welfare of my cats

- 2.1. The health and welfare of my cats is my primary concern and I will take appropriate steps to ensure this is maintained at all times. I will take steps to minimise the spread of disease between cats by restricting contact between at risk cats, both on and off my premises. I will limit numbers to ensure this is possible.
- 2.2. I will maintain a good relationship with a veterinary practice who will support my endeavours.

3. Regarding the sale & placement of kittens

- 3.1. I will ensure to the best of my abilities that any cats I breed go to responsible, loving homes, where they will be properly cared for.
- 3.2. I will ensure kittens leave for their new homes fully vaccinated, insured and appropriately treated for parasites, vet health checked and to the best of my knowledge in good health.
- 3.3. In addition to the GCCF documentation and pedigree I will ensure that cats leave for their new homes with written information detailing their health records (including worming and flea treatments and vaccinations), feeding regime, general care and recommendations for neutering, or already neutered. Registration paperwork may not form part of this paperwork if ownership is already being processed by the GCCF at the request of the breeder or for any other genuine reason agreed between both parties at the time of sale.
- 3.4. I shall ensure that new owners are given information about, and contact details for the GCCF affiliated breed clubs I am a member of, relevant to the breed of the kitten.
- 3.5. I will ensure that all new owners are provided with a feedback form to assist with the quality assurance aspects of this scheme.
- 3.6. I will encourage the new owner to contact me should they need any help or advice and reply to any request promptly.
- 3.7. I will interact with fellow breeders and owners in a truthful and courteous manner.

4. My breeding practices

- 4.1. I will only mate a queen who is healthy and in good condition, and only as often as is appropriate for her wellbeing.
- 4.2. I will not accept into stud any queen that is registered with non-active status with the GCCF, or whose registration with another bona fide organisation is endorsed "not for breeding".
- 4.3. I shall do my best to ensure that any adult, former breeding cat that requires rehoming is neutered, and placed in the care of a suitably experienced person.

5. Regarding my Relationship with the GCCF

- 5.1. I am the holder of a GCCF registered prefix and I consent to the GCCF adding my personal contact details to the GCCF Breeder Scheme website.
- 5.2. I shall register or declare all my kittens born to GCCF registered parents.
- 5.3. I shall not engage with breeding programmes involving breeds not recognised by the GCCF for welfare or genetic reasons.
- 5.4. I am familiar with the GCCF's requirements for members of the Breeder Scheme and understand that

the GCCF may on occasions contact my new kitten owners directly for the purpose of monitoring the effectiveness of the scheme. I understand that if I do not comply with this code of ethics I may be removed from the scheme.

peace of mind... look for the GCCF's own "kitemark". Breeders who are successful in applying to join the GCCF Breeder Scheme, displaying their commitment to healthy breeding, will be given a certificate displaying their names, the breed for which they have been certified, their membership number and the expiry date. They will also be given an electronic personalised copy of the Scheme's logo.

The logo will display the breeders own unique reference number, based on when they joined the scheme as well as the month and year that they renewed their membership. This is written along the bottom of the scheme's logo and would read as follows:-"GCCF Breeder Scheme No. 000XXX 1/17" for example.

Breed Scheme members may display the logo on their website, email and on their paperwork or when placing an advert for their kittens.

Breeder Scheme members are also required to give you a copy of the New Owner Questionnaire which is sent directly into the Office as an independent check that as members they are adhering to the code of ethics.

The questions are not onerous but are designed to give an insight into the breeders breeding practice, and the environment in which the kittens are being raised.

New Owner Questionnaire

Breeder's Name, Prefix, Breed, Date kitten or cat was collected, along with your name, address, telephone number and email address:

- 1. Where did you find out about your breeder?
- 2. Are you happy that your kitten(s) or Cat (s) appear healthy?
- 3. Were you happy that the breeder's cats appeared well cared for? (If you ticked "No" please provide further details in the comments section overleaf.)
- 4. a, If the cat you purchased was a kitten did you meet the Mum?
- b, If the breeder owned the Father did you meet him?
- 5. Did you receive a vaccination card completed by a vet?
- 6. a, Have you received your cat's GCCF registration certificate? B, Were you encouraged to transfer the cat into your own name?
- 7. Have you received insurance documents?
- 8. Please tick which aspects of cat care you were given written advice on: General Care, Neutering, Feeding Regime, Worming, Flea Treatments, Vaccinations.
- 9. Have you needed to contact your breeder since collecting your cat?
- 10. If so, did you receive a prompt and polite reply?

Quality Care for a Lifetime -a difference which can be measured.

Kittens are magical creatures, it is enormous fun to watch them grow and learn, playing with their siblings or their human owners and toys. Kittens should go to their new owner as happy, healthy, confident, playful bundles of fur. They should be well socialised, and after a small amount of settling in time, should display all the inquisitive outgoing characteristics of their breed.

Compare this to the timid, small, barely weaned cats, sold by back yard breeders – with no vaccinations, no pedigree, and no back up, and the question you need to ask yourself is this:

Who would I want to buy a kitten from?



Breeder Scheme Certificate of Membership

Highlight on: Section 1

There are a lot of unsung heroes and many hours of hard work and difficult decisions go into not only producing but keeping a breed standard fit for purpose. Many experts are needed not only in breeding, judging and showing, but also in genetics, understanding the building blocks of life, along with the discipline needed to breed only cats that will be healthy and robust, but also those which have the expectation of a long and happy life. For a NEW breed to be added to the stable of breeds which the GCCF currently recognises, the prospective breeders, owners and experts have to not only meet but also satisfy stringent criteria. In order to understand that process better, let us take a closer look at one of the oldest foundation breeds of the GCCF that of the Persian Cat and the work which is undertaken by their BAC.

Gersians Gr the GCCF

The policies governing the breeding and registration of Persian cats in GCCF are developed and monitored by the Persian Breed Advisory Committee.


Historically there were 5 separate BACs covering the different pattern groups in Persians, but these were amalgamated to form one BAC 3 years ago. Since the amalgamation, much work has been undertaken to update the various policies. This includes a Breeding Policy describing the genetic make-up of the breed. as well as other information on the origins of the breed, colours and patterns etc. There is also a comprehensive section on the correct breeding system for Persians, including a section on genetic

health issues and brachycephaly. The Registration Policy was completely re-vamped to expand the permitted colours that can be used for each pattern group, and includes an outcross; this is something GCCF has in place that that the Kennel Club doesn't.

Any breeder experiencing problems could use it, and it's there to ensure that the breed isn't reliant only on genetic inheritance that is locked into a restricted gene pool in which the genetic factors in brachycephalic syndrome must be endlessly recycled. Mandatory testing for PKD for registration on the Active Register and PRA(pd) testing for imports was also included. Finally, last year the Standard of Points was also completely re-written, to give a much more comprehensive description for Judges to adhere to, this included a description for the nose emphasising "nose leather fully formed and nostrils well open, allowing free passage of air." The BAC monitors Judges' reports (which are published on the GCCF website), to ensure that Judges adhere to the laid-down standard.

The BAC is also following the work of the Brachycephalic Working Group, set up in 2016, which was formed to focus on improving the health and welfare of brachycephalic dogs, as their goals for breed health and for a partnership approach between the veterinary profession, registering bodies, animal charities and breeders will also impact on cat breeders. Whilst the research being undertaken at Cambridge University Department of Veterinary Medicine into Obstructive Brachycephalic Syndrome (BOAS) relates to dog breeds such as Bulldogs, Pugs and French Bulldogs, it may also assist understanding of avoiding extreme

conformation (much worse in brachycephalic dogs than cats it has to be said).

GCCF has always taken pedigree cat health seriously, and over 30 years ago the Veterinary Advisory Committee put forward proposals which were passed by Council in 1985. When the Standards of Points book was reprinted in February 1986 it was prefaced for the first time by a list of defects common to all breeds, and a full description of the skull, eyes, nose, nose leather, nostrils, body and limbs. The preface has been reviewed by the GCCF Veterinary Advisory Committee and the Board of Directors several times since then and several slight amendments have been made; it is always under review by the GCCF Genetics Committee, and is available to view on the GCCF website. At GCCF shows all cats are vetted in. Vets are instructed to reject for 'gross malformation... or severe expression of any the standard faults in the SOP booklet' - it's another example of the precautions taken for health.

How you can help

In 2017 GCCF registered 1027 Persian kittens – the 6th most popular breed by registration numbers - but many, many more will have been bred by "back-yard breeders". Sadly, internet kitten and puppy sale sites have fuelled the market for third party sales. Many of these kittens will not have been bred according to GCCF's breeding or registration policy, may be leaving their mum far too early, without full vaccinations and probably from untested parents. The mantra is Responsible Breeding – Responsible Buying.

Persians are a healthy, long-lived breed and should not suffer any more health problems than the average cat if they are bred correctly and not indiscriminately. Please research before you buy.

GCCF Area Clubs, Societies & Chsociations

The GCCF has over 150 clubs, societies and associations which are full members of its governing body. Where the "association/club/society" mentions a breed by name, they are classed as a **Breed Club** which caters for the Breed or Colours specified in the name. Where a "association/club/society club" mentions a location then they are classed as an **All-Breed** Club. A list of the Breed Clubs may be found in the sections of the breeds they cater for. A list of all the All-Breed/Area club follows below.

Two notable additions to the list # the Guild of GCCF Judges and Stewards is a specialist club catering for qualified GCCG Stewards and Judges and those on the training schemes of the disciplines.

*The GCCF Young Exhibitors' Scheme (YES!) and YES! Kitten Club are variously open to 8-16 year olds and the under 8's. Both are open to any child or young person who is interested to learn more about cats and GCCF shows. The programme covers all of the UK mainland and Northern Ireland.

What constitutes a Pointed Cat John H Hansson



This is relatively simple to those who know, possibly not to those with no clue about colour and or pattern, cat genetics can be quite complicated.

I'll try and keep this simple, a pointed cat is an exhibit which displays what is known as the Himalayan gene.

Next question what is the Himalayan gene? In simple terms it is a semi albino, where colour is basically restricted to the extremities contrasting with the body colour which may have some body shading to a greater or lesser degree depending on the colour and/or pattern variation (this well exceeds 120 possible permutations if my maths proves

correct), not all colours are accepted in all the breeds which recognise the gene. All with blue eyes, which is an essential part of the criteria.

Most easily recognisable for the majority is the Siamese breed. Though this gene exists in every section, some sections having more than one breed variety with a Himalayan Pattern.

In section 1 we have LH Colourpoint and the SH version known as Exotics. Section 2 has number of possible variations with Birmans, three varieties of Ragdoll and also Siberians known a Neva Masquerade in some organisations. In section 3 we have the British SH which again come in Colourpointed, as well as Colourpointed & White, as well as Selkirk Rex which come in LH & SH versions. Also in this section there is the potential for British LH. Section 4 presents us with a number of breeds which accept the gene as an accepted pattern, these include Cornish Rex, Devon Rex, LaPerm, Snowshoe, Blue Eyed Snow Bengal (though not obviously so due to pattern). In section 5 we have Colour Pointed Tonkinese. In section 6 we have the breed which is possibly the most easily recognisable of all, the Siamese but these also come in the LH version, Balinese & Oriental Bi-Colours which also come in Pointed varieties. The blue eyes giving the show away.

This I will hopefully give the uninitiated a bit of background. There is a great deal more but it would complicate things.





GCCF Cat of the Year Awards

The Cat of the Year award is a Pedigree Award where each breeds Standard of Points are the qualifying criteria. There is no Cat of the Year award for the overall Non-Pedigree/Pedigree Pets, as they are not shown under any breed standard, but their own criteria. However their achievements are recognised by their section titles of Best Household Pet and Best Pedigree Pet.

For Pedigree Cats, the Cat of the Year award is a mark of excellence, for those truly exceptional cats which sometimes come along only once in a lifetime, if you're lucky. This award goes beyond the titles offered to show cats as they (hopefully) move up the ranks of certificates and titles from one level and onto the next, and focusses instead on those cats who consistently win not only titles over the course of a show year, (in the case of adults and neuters), but who also frequently win the Best of Variety/Best of Section and Best in Show too.

The Rules of the Competition

GCCF is an organisation that is comprised of clubs, associations and societies. Therefore it is the clubs, associations and societies which are said to be the members of GCCF not the individual showing or entering their cat/s at a show. The Cat of the Year Awards are made on behalf of GCCF to exhibitors who have entered shows run by the GCCFs' constituent clubs/associations and societies.

Points are only awarded at GCCF member club, association or society CHAMPIONSHIP shows. Other shows and events, even if holding a show licence are not part of GCCF and will not count. These include both National Pet shows, which though counting towards status for the exhibits concerned DO NOT count in terms of points towards the COTY winners as these events are NOT GCCF club shows.

Additionally as GCCF is the awarding organisation, its own show The GCCF Supreme Show does NOT COUNT towards any COTY points.

Points allocation

Points are awarded as follows:

- 1 point each Best of Variety Win.
- 1 additional point for Overall Best of Variety.
- 1 additional point for Overall Best in Show (Best HP or PP to be awarded an additional Point, to ensure they can accumulate the same number of points).
- For back-to-back shows (two shows sharing the same venue on the same date) if there is an Overall Winner 1 additional Point is earned.

This means that the maximum points awarded at any single show is 3 points.


The maximum points awarded at a back to back show is 4 points.

Congratulations to all contenders, this year, some of the titles have been very closely contested, particularly the Persian and Oriental sections. It is also interesting to note that there are some exhibits also featured as last year's winners, indicating quality endures.


